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


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LOCAL HANDYMAN KEEPS neighborhood homes safe

Changing Your Mindset Can Improve Your Approach to Golf

ne of the differences between a championship player and an average player is the amount and kind of focus they bring to becoming highly skilled.

Many golfers want to become good players. They spend time practicing, but their mindset is capricious. Accordingly, their progress will be limited, and their competitive results will reflect it.

Championship players, however, have a purpose and a plan to everything they do. They spend their time and energy wisely, effectively. They diligently work on those essential areas, which can lower their scores and will allow them to execute successful shots when in the heat of battle.

Interestingly, the first step in developing a championship mindset is to get into the habit of establishing goals for every part of the development process. Goals are powerful because they distill many disparate thoughts into a single purpose.

Communication of goals between an instructor and a student creates a unity of thought, which results in faster progress.



When goals are reached, the player experiences the great satisfaction of achievement, and he knows he is getting better.

Setting goals should start at a high level. The first question I ask of a new student is, "Why are you playing golf, and what do you hope to get out of it?" Many students look at me blankly, not knowing what to say. Some of my younger students will answer, "I want to play on the PGA Tour," or "I want to earn a scholarship." Other older students will say, "I want to beat my buddies. I am tired of buying lunch." Eventually, I will elicit a response. The main point of this exchange is the fact we are instantly communicating, and we have established a purpose for what we are going to do. That is progress.

Every player should establish a firm set of goals for all phases of their game. Writing those goals down is even more powerful. I ask my younger students to do this because it creates an indelible imprint, which helps to propel them forward. Start with high-level goals stating where you want to go with your game. You will be making tangible progress, just like my students.

Kitchens and bathrooms are the main rooms that sell a home. The kitchen is the focal point and heart of any home. The cabinets and countertops are the first thing



buyers notice and make the biggest impact. Before you embark on changing the countertops, however, make sure your cabinets are in good condition. There is no point in adding new countertops if the buyer will have to replace the cabinets anyway. If the cabinets are in good condition but outdated, depending on the type of wood, they can be refinished, painted or just the doors replaced for a fraction of the cost of new ones.

If you are going to repaint your cabinets, unless you have the time and patience and know how to do it property, I recommend you get this done professionally. You can tell those sellers who paint their own cabinets. While they may look fine, when I take my buyers to view the home and we look at them closely, you always can tell. They stick when opening them or are starting to peel or fade. The finish is uneven, and the buyer knows the cabinets will have to be redone professionally in a few months.

Replacing the countertops can really transform the look of a kitchen and have a huge impact. While granite countertops are still in, the new trend right now is quartz.

When you get the bid for the kitchen, ask about the cost for the bathrooms. You may even have enough granite/quartz left over to do the bathrooms or at least one of them at no extra cost other than the install.

A really simple inexpensive change you can do to the bathroom is replace the existing mirror with a framed mirror. Kirkland and Home Goods have really nice framed mirrors, which are very inexpensive at \$50 to \$100. If you are a handy person, you can buy the wood from The Home Depot and just add it around the existing mirror.

Replace those lovely old gold vanity lights with new ones you also can get from The Home Depot or Lowe's Home Improvement for under \$100. Match faucets if yours are outdated. If the cabinets are in good condition, you can paint or refinish them. If the budget will allow, add granite or quartz countertops, too. With bathrooms, you usually can find large enough leftover pieces of granite or quartz, which cost a lot less than a full slab. Even if all you do is the framed mirror and light fixture, the result still will have a big impact for a small cost.

FLOORING

Hopefully, having your carpets professionally cleaned will spruce them up enough. If they are old or soiled and need to be replaced, however, it is well worth the expense. While carpets are still good for the bedrooms, buyers prefer tile or wood in the main areas of the home. The latest trend is the mixture of both of these, the new wood-like tile. It is durable, easy to maintain and can totally transform the look of a home.

Since 1968, the International Baccalaureate (IB) Program has been inspiring students from around the world by combining a world-class education with an intercultural understanding and respect for others.

"The IB program offers the gold standard for academic rigor and college preparation, and our goal is to make college dreams come true for students," said Dr. Jake Davis, IB coordinator at Westwood High School. "Colleges and universities seek IB students, because they not only do well academically in high school, but also go on to perform well at the university level."

Last year, every Westwood IB student received at least one scholarship. Many acquired multiple offers, which garnered more than \$7.2 million in scholarships, grants and awards. This included three students who were named Flinn Scholars. The merit-based scholarship, given to only 20 Arizona seniors, is valued at more than \$115,000.

The IB program is available to students in kindergarten

through grade 12. Summit Academy serves students from kindergarten through grade eight. Mesa Academy for Advanced Studies provides a middle-years program for students in grades six through eight. Westwood High School offers students in grades nine through12. Students enrolled in these schools have the opportunity to participate in the program.

They gravitate to leadership roles, like class president, and they are involved in clubs and activities, such as National Honor Society. "The IB program taught me practical life skills that prepared me for college," she said. "My successes were rewarded with college credit, a collegiate-level writing experience and a drive to continue to challenge myself academically for the rest of my life."



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There Is Much To Consider With A New Dog In The House

Thristmas has come and gone, and puppies have infiltrated many happy households since Santa's ✔ visit, and whether you adopted an adult dog or puppy from a local shelter or rescue, there are some things you need to know—especially if you are a firsttime dog owner.

Puppies are a lifelong commitment, and February is the busiest month for animal shelters because too many people realize they don't have time to commit to their new family member. Training is a lot of work and takes time, and every dog deserves consistent mental and physical stimulation. So, what can you do to ensure your new furry friend smoothly integrates into your life?

Start slowly and low-key—Puppies and newly adopted adult dogs may have a difficult time transitioning into your home. Do not force it. Let them come around on their terms. I know that you are eager to get to know your new bundle of joy, but if you force the issue, they may

become more fearful. Being in a new place around strangers can be very overwhelming. Positive reinforcement can help in these situations. Give your dog lots of treats and praise for coming out and being brave. It goes a long way.

Proper potty training—Improper potty training lands dogs in the shelter all too often. It's frustrating if your dog is having accidents in the house. This can, however, be easily avoided. Potty training, using positive reinforcement methods, only takes a few days. You just have to be consistent. Every time you take your dog outside to do his business, offer him treats immediately afterward, and give him lots of praise. Do this several times a day for a few days to a week, and you should have a potty trained dog. Remember, the younger your dog is, the more frequently he will need to go potty.

Find a veterinarian—If you don't already have a go-to veterinarian, do some research on well-respected and reliable vets in your area. It's imperative to have a trusted professional to take care of your dog in the case of vaccinations, spay/neuter surgeries and yearly exams.

Socialization—Puppy socialization at a young age is imperative. It's recommended your puppy have proper vaccinations before getting to know others or going out into public. Parvo is common among puppies not vaccinated, and it can be deadly. Once your puppy is vaccinated, take him to doggy play dates, or bring him to Happy Pets Palace for Puppy Wednesday. Ideally you want to have your puppy socialized between the ages of 8 and 12 weeks.

Training—Puppies (and all other dogs) are easy to train if you are consistent, patient and use positive reinforcement. Dogs respond quickly to treat-based and reward-based training. Seek out a dog trainer in your area, or consider checking out training classes at a pet retailer, such as PetSmart. I would suggest making sure the trainers don't use any sort of shock collar or fear-based training.

Set a routine—All dogs appreciate routine. The sooner you can start one, the better. Make potty training and basic obedience training part of your routine, at least at the beginning. This will ensure your dog is getting the training needed, and it helps create a bond between you and your new canine companion.

Set up a family understanding—Who is going to feed the dog and when? Who is going to take the dog on walks and work on training? Who will be responsible for vet appointments for vaccinations and deworming? These are all important points, which should be discussed among your household in order to create harmony for everyone.

Although spending time with your new pup is important for a smooth transition into your family, it's impossible to ask you to devote every waking moment to your dog. 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
