Sunshine Acres does not receive government support for the children and although donor-funded, does no fundraising/solicitation for themselves. Many friends, businesses, churches, and volunteers contribute and host fundraising events on behalf of the home, and God is still working miracles.

2023 Mid-Year Mesa Real Estate Market Update

ast year was a wild ride in the housing market where mortgage rates doubled, and sales plummeted in the second half of the year.

The dramatic rate hikes and bidding wars stopped buyers dead in their tracks and the demand pretty much vanished overnight, triggering prices to drop. By the end of the year Mesa inventory



had increased by 138 percent from May to December while home prices decreased.

DEMAND

There was a lot of talk and speculation that prices would continue to plummet, and we were heading for another housing market crash. While we knew this wasn't going to happen for many different reasons, the fear of a repeat of 2008 kept buyers sitting on the fence waiting to see what was going to happen.

As it became clear that we had a correction and the market wasn't going to crash, buyers who had put their buying process on hold for the past six months started coming back into the market.

SUPPLY

It soon became obvious that the days of three or four percent mortgage rates were gone for the foreseeable future, and it was more likely that rates would increase. Prices had come down 21 percent, which helped with the higher interest rates.

In January buyers started to come back to the market and it wasn't long before the extra supply was quickly snapped up. By June 17 the supply had decreased to 456 single-family homes for sale in Mesa compared to 985 in January.

MEDIAN SALES PRICE

With demand increasing and supply decreasing in early 2023, we saw prices bottom out in December 2022 and they have increased every month since. With December seeing the lowest median price since July 2021 at \$430,000, by June 2023 it has increased to \$495,000, which is a 15 percent increase so far this year.

IF RATES DROP

If rates were to drop, especially if we got back into the five percent range, buyers would be out in force. With the already low supply, an influx of buyers could start a bit of a frenzy again, but it may be just for a shorter period of time.

With lower rates, it could also give the sellers who have been holding off selling and getting rid of their super-low mortgage rates a reason to sell and bring more inventory back to the market.

IS NOW A GOOD TIME TO BUY OR SELL

It used to be that we could predict the housing market with at least some certainty based on statistics, seasonal trends, market conditions, etc., but if there is one thing this market has taught us in the last four years is that this housing market is more unpredictable than ever.

IF YOU ARE A BUYER

Prices are continuing to increase and interest rates have stabilized. If rates do drop, you will be competing with more buyers, and in an already under-supplied market, prices will increase. So, while the interest rate may be less it could cost you more to purchase the home. If



you purchase now and interest rates drop, then you can refinance and get a lower rate anyway.

Of course, prices could drop again, and you could pay less for the home, but as price is driven by supply and demand and we have such a shortage of supply, we don't expect that to happen any time soon.

IF YOU ARE A SELLER

We know that if you price your home at the right price and market the home as well, now is a great time to sell due to the lack of supply. Fewer homes mean less competition.

It also depends on where you are planning to move to. If you are staying in the same market, it doesn't matter as much because the home you purchase will increase or decrease along with the home you are selling, so it balances out. Plus, if you are getting a mortgage and rates come down, you can refinance at that time and get the lower rate.

IN A NUTSHELL

2023 is a lot stronger market than how it looked at the end of last year. Demand is coming back while at the same time supply is dwindling. We are back in a sellers' market and in certain price ranges, we are seeing multiple offers again. We would expect it to slow down for the summer and through the holidays, but if there is any decrease in rates you will probably see the market pick up again pretty quickly.

The first order of business is the settlement of the estate. Once the home is legally received as an inheritance, deciding to sell, rent, or keep the home is the first step in determining what to do next.

Often heirs live out of state or there are multiple heirs, so we have found that the majority of our clients elect to sell the property they have inherited. For those who decide to sell the home, it is a good idea to work with a team of professionals including an estate lawyer, accountant, and a Realtor with estate experience who can offer advice and guidance throughout the process.

Although each situation is unique, here are a few tips to consider when you have inherited a home:

Make a Short-Term Plan to Maintain and Secure the Property.

One of the first things to address when inheriting a property is the maintenance and care of the property. The mortgage, taxes, homeowners' insurance, HOA dues, utilities, and routine services (landscaping/ pool/pest service) need to be maintained. It is also beneficial to make sure someone is checking on the home regularly in case any issues arise (i.e. green pool, fallen tree, auto-ship package deliveries, HVAC issues, etc). Additionally, make sure the property is properly secured and provide the neighbors with your contact information in case they see anything of concern at the property.

Learn About the Property.

Do your best to learn about the home in preparation for the sale. Are there invoices for repairs? Are there service agreements for HVACs or other mechanicals? Are there any remaining warranties on appliances, HVACs, the roof, or termite treatments? Is any of the equipment leased (water systems, solar, alarms, etc.)? If you are not familiar with the property, this part requires some investigative work including calling maintenance providers who may have recently worked on the property, speaking to neighbors (who may know more than you realize), and evaluating paperwork. We recently sold an estate property and discovered that the owner had taped a list of her service providers inside a cabinet door. It was a great find that helped us quickly get information about the property!

• Consider Getting a Home Inspection.

Has the home been well maintained or is it in need of repairs? A home inspection will help you to understand the condition of your new asset. An inspection may also help you catch any imminent maintenance issues that could cause issues while you are preparing the home for sale (i.e. leaking water heater, faltering HVAC, roof leak, etc.).

• Empty the Property.

Sorting through the belongings of a loved one is the most overwhelming, time-consuming, and emotional part of inheriting property. Start by making a pile of items you wish to keep in one room of the house. Then, set up a weekend when family members can shop the house for items they may want. After the



family weekend, organize to have a charity come and pick up the remaining items. Setting timelines for the clean out will keep the process from dragging on for years (yes, really years). Just remember, the longer you keep and maintain the property, the less you may net from the asset.

• Prepare the Property for Market.

Once the home has been emptied, evaluate the condition. Would it be wise to invest in fresh paint and new carpet? At a minimum, a thorough cleaning is a must. 

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Common Medicare Questions Answered

Submitted by Lynne Jones, Tapestry Insurance edicare decisions are highly personal and there may be as many different questions about Medicare as there are beneficiaries, maybe more. But certain questions seem to come up more often than others.

nore often than others. Here are some of the most

common Medicare questions and answers. How Do I Know What Medicare Coverage is Right

for Me? The answer to this may be easy to say but maybe not as easy to do. You need to understand your personal healthcare needs and choose Medicare coverage to help meet them. For example, if you take prescription drugs right now when you get Medicare, you need to make sure you get Part D prescription drug coverage through either a stand-alone Part D plan or a Medicare Advantage plan.

How Much Does Medicare Cost? You will likely pay the Part B premium to Medicare. Beyond that, you may pay other premiums, deductibles, co-pays, and co-insurance. The total amount you pay will depend on the type of Medicare plan(s) you choose and the health care services you use during the year.

What Do I Do About Medicare if I Work Past Age 65? If you plan to work past 65, you may be able to delay enrolling in Medicare. Or, you may have to enroll during your Initial Enrollment Period in Parts A, B, and D if you want to avoid late penalties. It will depend on your employer and if your employer coverage is creditable.

Some people who can delay Medicare still choose to enroll in just Part A when they turn 65 in addition to their



employer coverage. Part A is premium-free if you or your spouse worked and paid Medicare taxes for at least 10 years. Note though, if you do get Part A, you can no longer contribute to your HSA.

How Can I Get Dental and Vision Coverage with Medicare? Original Medicare (Parts A & B) does not cover routine dental or vision care; however, some Medicare Advantage (Part C) plans do. Plans include all the coverage provided by Parts A and B, and often additional benefits like dental, vision, hearing, and gym memberships, all in one plan.

Is Medicare Mandatory? No part of Medicare is mandatory, but if you choose to enroll in any part of Medicare after your Initial Enrollment Period, you could face financial penalties unless you qualify for a Special Enrollment Period with creditable employer coverage.

What's the Difference Between Medicare and Medicaid? Medicare and Medicaid are both government healthcare programs, but they are very different. Medicare is generally for people who are 65 or older, or who have a qualified disability. Medicaid is a state-governed program for people with limited income and resources. Some people are eligible for both Medicare and Medicaid. These people are considered *dual eligible* and are often qualified for special Medicare plans.

Do You Have Additional Questions About Medicare? Medicare is complex, and it can often feel overwhelming when you're learning about Medicare and shopping around for coverage for the first time. If you have further questions, I would love to be your guide. ■

Retirees should talk finances with grown children
