They were grandparents with no income, 11 years of mortgage payments, no electricity and a well with a broken pump. God impressed upon us very strongly that this was His work. We were to take care of the children, and He would take care of the finances." This was the beginning of the Miracle in the Desert.

READING TO CHILDREN Leads to School Success

s a school leader, one of my favorite activities is to visit classrooms to teach, talk with students, and watch them interact with each other and their teachers.

On one occasion, when visiting Self Development Preschool's 3-year old class, I noted an interaction between a child who was barely 3 years old and Ms. Vernetta Madsen, the director of the preschool. Both of them were sitting next to each other on the carpet in the room.

The little child was holding a book with pictures and having a conversation with Ms. Vernetta. The little girl was trying to build a story while getting ready to pretend to read the book she was holding. She asked Ms. Vernetta what characters would she want in her story. The little child explained that they should have animals and a person. Then, she asked Ms. Vernetta, "Where will the story take place?" Next, she asked what should happen in the story. Much to my amazement, this 3-year-old further queried, "What should be the plot of the story?" Based on the information she gathered, this little girl began reading the story to Ms. Vernetta, pausing frequently, carefully turning the pages, and mimicking adult behavior.

The preschool and kindergarten years are a time of great joy and learning. These are the formative years when students begin to relate with the printed words in the book. They begin forming fond memories of being read to and reading with the special adults in their lives. The type of books adults select to read to children fosters the youngsters' love for reading and their school success.

The selection of books should take into consideration the developmental levels of children. Another consid-

eration for the selection of books for early years should include children's interests. These carefully selected books not only increase children's vocabulary, but also help lay the foundation for reading for pleasure.

Research documents the fact reading with young children is the single most significant activity for helping children become literate. Reading books with children enhances vocabulary, brings awareness about the world surrounding them, and motivates them to become readers and knowledge seekers. Through their interactions with books, children learn books have a structure and a different way of communication. Similar to the example of the 3-year old child discussed earlier, children who are read to regularly and frequently soon learn about the characters in the books, the stories the books contain, and the special means of communication through print.

Children who are read to extensively develop a literate



way of communication. Being read to also helps students develop a rich vocabulary, extends language interactions, and improves children's literacy. Children's earliest years provide the foundation upon which later literary skills are built. By building a relationship with print, repetition, modeling and oral language, parents and preschool programs lay the foundation for later success.

With its rich selection of books and regular shared reading opportunities with adults, students at Self Development Preschool are ready to learn and succeed in a rigorous kindergarten program. CHEF MATTHEW'S RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Ahi Ponzu and Grilled Bok Choy Salad

Salad Ingredients

- 44-ounce pieces of Ahi tuna
- 1 each—yellow bell pepper, cut into thin julienne
- 1/2 each—fennel bulb, thinly shaved fennel bulb rings 1 each—cucumber cut into ribbons (thinly sliced
- planks on mandolin) 1 head of butter leaf lettuce. Tear delicately into large
- pieces. Don't over tear, or it will ruin the lettuce.
- 1 head frisee lettuce (optional)—use only the light
- 1 head of bok choy—separated at rood, rinse and dry—oil and season stalks then grill until stalks are tender. Don't burn all of the greens.
- 2 each—won ton squares—Cut into strips then fry.
- 1 batch of soy ginger vinaigrette

Ponzu marinade for Ahi

- 4 cups orange juice
- 1/2 cup lime juice
- 1 cup grapefruit juice
- 1/2 cup soy sauce
- 4 garlic cloves—thinly sliced
- 1 shallot-fine chop
- 1/2 bunch of cilantro—rough chop
- 2 tablespoons Sriracha Chili Sauce
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 2 tablespoons fine chopped ginger
- 1 teaspoon black pepper (ground)

Combine all ingredients minus cilantro in a pot to heat. The only purpose for heating is to dissolve sugar. Forgo heating if done well in advance to marinating

Tuna should not be in marinade for any longer than 48 hours.

Soy ginger vinaigrette

- 2 tablespoons soy sauce
- 1/4 cup rice wine vinegar
- 11/2 tablespoons Dijon mustard
- 1 tablespoon rough chopped ginger
- 1/2 cup brown sugar

Place all ingredients in blender and pulse. Slowly add in 1 cup neutral oil (veggie, canola).

All recipes are subject to one's own taste. Play around with the salty, sweet, and spicy.







n 2012, voters approved a \$230 million bond issue for Mesa Public Schools.

These funds are providing much needed upgrades to their facilities, technology infrastructure and transportation services. A critical need currently being addressed is the issue of aging computers for instruction and productivity.

TECHNOLOGY WITH A PURPOSE

As the demand for technology increases and new software programs are adopted, older computers do not have the required processing power. The initiative currently under way far exceeds the scope of a traditional computer refresh project. Mesa Public Schools stands to fundamentally change the way in which instruction is facilitated in the classroom through technology. Teachers will employ a device, which takes full advantage of the recent advances in mobile Windows technology, a well as the district's ongoing initiative to provide all school and administrative sites with wireless Internet access by August 2014.

The district's Information Systems and Education



Technology departments will provide a Lenovo Helix Ultrabook powered by Windows 8.1 to every certificated teacher and administrator through a series of four consecutive deployment cycles. The rollout will be completed by end of the fall semester.

According to Nathan Myers, educational technology department specialist, "This is an exciting initiative as Mesa Public Schools has the opportunity to provide each teacher with an educational technology tool for engaging online content and digital resources to students while facilitating teaching and learning in a manner not previously possible."

FACILITATING CLASSROOM INSTRUCTION

The Helix is a powerful tool with incredible flexibility. Each classroom will be outfitted with a docking station, which connects the Helix to a full-sized monitor, mouse and keyboard, providing a traditional desktop workstation. By simply removing or untethering the device from its docking station, the Helix becomes a tablet, freeing teachers to move about the classroom. The school's wireless infrastructure supports access to online resources, while a wireless display receiver, or WiDi, attached to a projector, allows broadcasting both audio and video content from anywhere within the room. With the flick of a wrist, a teacher can share content with the class by projecting it onto a SMART Board.

TEACHERS ON THE GO







Finding Solutions to Difficult Issues **DRIVES SENATE RE-ELECTION BID**

wo years ago, the political landscape changed in East Mesa when Bob Worsley unseated longtime State Senator Russell Pearce.

"I had no intention of

ever running for public office," said the now incumbent Republican State Senator. "A group of close associates invited me to breakfast for what I thought was going to be a conversation about who we should encourage to run. It turned out I was the target. I declined, of course." Yet, over the next couple of days, and through conversations with his wife and family, Senator Worsley consistently returned to the question, "If I don't, who will?"

He followed the question with an explanation. "You've got to remember," said Senator Worsley, "these were not politically happy times. Our state's reputation (and Mesa, in particular) had taken a hit because our political leaders were focusing on divisive issues with harsh rhetoric. And East Valley citizens were paying the price."

Senator Worsley points out the fact many in his district were not happy with their representation at the state level. Specifically, leaders had lost sight of the bigger, more meaningful issues in pursuit of symbolic legislation, which only served to polarize voters. "This is why I ultimately decided to run," he admitted. "We simply could

not afford a continuation of the status quo."

So, two years later and facing his first re-election bid, how does Senator Worsley feel things have gone? "We've made great strides in restoring civility and elevating the level of discourse," he said, "but there still is work to be done." His focus is on finding practical solutions where each side is invested in a positive outcome. "Zero-sum-style politics does not lead to good legislation," he quipped. "This process is not about right or left. It's about solutions."

What are those solutions you might ask? "There are many," the senator said, "but take what I was able to accomplish with our state's sales tax code as an example." He is referring to what was widely regarded as one of the most burdensome and needlessly complex sales tax codes in the country. "It didn't need to be that way, and everybody seemed to agree," he stated emphatically. Yet, when it came time to pass a bill to simplify the sales tax code, political disagreements almost guaranteed it would fail. "This seemed crazy to me," he further stated. "Individually, every group involved supported the idea, yet, collectively, they were unable to work together."

That is where Senator Worsley entered the scene. "I brought all the parties to the table, and cut through discord," he stated. "This was not about ideology or political points. It was about making it easier for businesses to operate, and making it more efficient for government to manage sales tax reporting and collection."

The bill passed, and Arizona now has one of the most business-friendly sales tax codes in the country. It is solutions like this Senator Worsley believes our state desperately needs. "There's no reason partisan bickering should ever get in the way of serving the best interest of our citizens," he said. "That's why I ran two years ago, and that's why I'm running again." ■






