

Ms. Carol's Gymkids is family-friendly fun

If you are looking for healthy fun the whole family can enjoy, the new location of Ms. Carol's Gymkids is the place.

Ms. Carol, aka Carol Strongoli, recently opened her new 5,000-square-foot gymnastics, dance, cheer and fitness center, at 116 N. Lindsay Road, not far from her previous location. The new gym features a 40-by 40-foot full spring competition floor, two in-ground and one upright trampolines, single and uneven bars, beams, a 30-foot tumble track, and an area for dance, cheer and adult fitness classes.

"Although our focus is on kids, we thought it would be fun to offer 30-minute adult fitness classes during our daily 60-minute classes for kids," Carol explained. "That way, parents can come and work out, and still have time to watch their children engage in their activities, too. The whole family can participate in exercising."

Carol has made sure families are able take part in the fun. "Because of our special family discounts, it is much

more affordable for parents and several children to be here together. We can even arrange events like birthday parties."

Carol, who is a certified aerobics instructor, has taught in the area for more than 30 years. Many of her Gymkids coaches are young women who were once her students. "In fact, a lot of my students now are children of my previous students," she said. "Because my own family lives back East, I have come to think of all my students as my extended family."

Carol's family-friendly fun has evolved over time. "At first, I had a mobile business," she related. "I would pack all my mats and exercise equipment into my truck, and travel around to local gyms and dance studios, conducting fitness classes for kids. We called it *Mousercise*," she said with a laugh. "Over time, parents started encouraging me to open my own business just for kids. So, for the last decade or so, I have had my own location. Now, we have an exciting brand new space."

Even though Carol wants her gym to be recreational, for fun and making friends, in a non-competitive atmosphere, that doesn't mean you can't get serious training here, too.

"We train to USA Gymnastics Competition Level 6, and teach all the compulsory routines. If students then want to go on to competition training, they can find the right coaches who will take them on to compete."

"The same is true for cheer. Cheer tryouts can be very emotional and intimidating," Carol said. "Our cheer class trains cheerleader hopefuls in all the required basic skills they must master to, at least, be considered in tryouts, such as doing a back handspring. If they go into tryouts knowing they can really do the routines, they will be much more confident in their performance, and have a better chance of making the squad," she continued. "It's tough

when you have some 60 girls trying out for only 10 or 15 available spots. We want to help them do their best."

Another unique feature of Carol's gymnastic school is that it is performance-based. "We put on our own annual shows, and also appear at events like Phoenix Suns games, the State Fair and the Gilbert Days Parade," she explained. "Our performances serve as a goal for the children to reach, along with all the benefits that go along with performing to an audience."

Self Development Academy kicks off new school year

▼ elf Development Academy (SDA) marked the start of a new school year on Aug. 6, its 14th since being founded by Dr. Anjum Majeed, the school's principal.

SDA consistently has been ranked among the community's top performing elementary and middle schools. In 2013, SDA was approved as a Cambridge International Examinations school. This year, the school will implement this curriculum, enhancing the already strong academic programs. Science and technology are areas of focus for the 2014-2015 school year.

Leonard Salvatori, a former environmental engineer and college professor, has joined the middle school faculty this year. With his science background and expertise, he is playing an integral role in the incorporation of the Cambridge science materials. Middle school science classes incorporate the subjects of biology, chemistry and physics (classes typically taken by high school students).

Students will have the opportunity to take Cambridge examinations, providing them with an international benchmark and ability to earn International General Certificate of Secondary Education certificates. Many prestigious colleges and universities recognize the course certificates.

Proficiency with technological skills is essential in this day and age. For the 2014-2015 school year, SDA purchased 15 laptop tablets and 60 laptops, as well as seven interactive boards, allowing for one interactive board per grade level.

Kindergarten students will utilize the laptop tablets in the classroom to reinforce phonics, reading and math concepts. By using the new portable laptops, students in grades one through eight will have the opportunity to learn keyboarding and other word processing programs. Outside resources will be available at teachers' and students' fingertips with the interactive boards.

Additionally, SDA is excited to pilot two robotics programs this fall. The first is the Lego Mindstorm Robotics program, for students in grades five through eight. Younger students will have the opportunity to participate in the First Lego League. These programs incorporate science, technology, engineering and mathematics. ■

if they have a good Realtor who they have used and can recommend.


Find a local Realtor, someone who really knows the area well. A local Realtor will have a good knowledge of the local real estate market and the area.


Ask how many homes the Realtor has sold in the past 12 months, and check out their website.







Mesa Public Schools unveils improvement projects

ew York may be the city that never sleeps, but Mesa Public Schools is the district that never rests. A tremendous amount of planning and preparation takes place to ensure a smooth opening in August. Employees worked through the summer renovating and improving school campuses to prepare

them for the new school year. Some of the changes are visible, while others impact the environment and comfort levels of students and staff members. Here is a snapshot view of some of the improvements.

SECURITY IS A TOP PRIORITY

A visit to a school campus will reveal visible security updates, including increased fencing around the school perimeter. This fencing ensures all visitors enter through the front office. Enhanced camera systems at schools alert district security staff to potential issues, day or night.

A new visitor management system on elementary campuses streamlines the check-in process, replacing sign-in sheets and logbooks. Parents and visitors check in at a kiosk. Each adult swipes his driver's license, the built-in camera snaps a picture, and a temporary visitor's sticker is printed. The system automatically logs the visit, and can alert staff of any security risks.

SOMETHING NEW IS COOKING IN THE KITCHEN

Irving and Whitman elementary schools received major kitchen remodels. Existing spaces were redesigned to optimize

layout and maximize productivity, with new flooring, ceilings, lighting and equipment. "The kitchens are absolutely beautiful," Loretta Zullo, director of food and nutrition, stated. "It has been a long time since they received attention. The renovations will make for a more pleasant dining experience for our students and working environments for our employees."

ARE YOU READY FOR SOME FOOTBALL?

During the summer, concession stands at six high schools underwent extensive renovations, thanks to the voter-approved bonds. Updates to visitor facilities are sure to delight folks when they experience new sinks, water systems, bathroom improvements and new windows. There also are new shaded extensions on the roof of the buildings, as well as the addition of air conditioning.

IT'S ALL CHILL

The installation of two new chilling towers on the Red Mountain High School campus will cool the main academic and performing arts buildings more efficiently and improve the air quality, leading to improved concentration. "The past couple of years, the units were on a decline and going out on a weekly basis," said Jim Gowdy, athletic director. "The new system is working great." ■



Empower Families Facing Childhood Cancer

ife changes in an instant any time a family learns their child is diagnosed with cancer, and with September being Childhood Cancer Awareness Month, a light shines on a group of dedicated professionals who help make this diagnosis a bit more bearable.

On the oncology floor, at the various hospitals around the Valley, are certified child life specialists. Receiving a bachelor's degree in a child life-related field, such as education, psychology, family studies or child development, in addition to receiving certification after a 480-hour unpaid internship, and taking a child life exam, you may become a child life specialist.

These pediatric health care professionals can be found in the emergency room and in surgery, as well as inpatient and outpatient clinics. Courtney Kissel is a child life specialist, on the oncology floor, at Cardon Children's Medical Center, in Mesa. "The tasks to become a child life specialist may seem daunting, but if this truly is your passion for your career, don't stop," she stated. "It is beyond

By 2020, all new child life specialists will be required to have a master's degree in child life. Arizona State University is beginning such a program.

Child life specialists are responsible for providing psychosocial support for those families having received a diagnosis, and to help them learn coping strategies to deal with the future. "I can do this by educating patients about their diagnosis, help them find normalcy through play, and keep their emotional well-being strong through self-esteem activities," Kim Froehle stated. Working hand in hand with the social workers, nurses and doctors, child life specialists are in most children's hospitals around the country, on all different floors.

Psychosocial support is achieved in many ways, including play in the playroom and at the bedside, as well

as through special events and activities provided by outside organizations. In addition, child life specialists prepare the child and family for procedures, help with understanding the diagnosis, and educate all involved as to what lies ahead."Through play, I love helping parents see their child again," said Jen Fleming. "I once had a mom tell me 'thank you' because all she could see when her son was first diagnosed was all the unfamiliar medical equipment near him and his changing mood due to his treatment."

For Courtney, being a child life specialist has given her a new perspective on life. "It is amazing what you see the families encounter and how they persevere," she said. "It makes you think twice about what is troubling you at the moment."

A recurring theme from all these child life specialists is how resilient these children are, and how they handle everything so much better than adults. "Nothing stops them from still being kids," Cathy House said. "No matter how sick they are, they continue to smile and play."

Going through the day offers challenges for a family of a child with cancer. Courtney's genuine and loving personality makes the days a bit brighter for her patients. "Hearing a family say, at the end of treatment, This was the best thing that has ever happened to us,' makes you realize you played a part in that process," she said. "You have been invited into this family's life, their deepest, darkest worries and fears, and have played a part in their healing by providing support and aid. When you hear a family say, 'How can we do this?' it makes you realize that being a child life specialist is a career worth achieving."

Jessica Driving Hawk, also a child life specialist, appreciates the various aspects of the role she plays."I love being present and witnessing the amazing bravery patients and families show us throughout their journey with cancer," she stated. "We get to be there for the bad and good days, and help in making the good days that
