participants. You can be part of the excitement on Oct. 12, in Downtown Phoenix. Monies raised benefit breast cancer research and patient support programs.






community. She completed a master's degree in secondary education, and is a highly qualified mathematics teacher.

With the recent split of Tiger Woods and golf instructor Sean Foley, I want to touch on the importance of instruction and knowing how to pick a great teacher.

If you are trying to decide about whether or not you should take a golf lesson, consider this... There is an endless amount of random information out there in the golf world on how you should learn the game. How do you know, however, what tips or drills are right for you? What is the proper sequence you should be going through in order to maximize your potential? Practicing is only valuable if you are practicing the right things, and the proper instructor should be able to decide what is correct for each individual student.

When choosing the right instructor, make sure this professional doesn't fit you into one specific model swing or method. Instead, this instructor should evaluate your physical build, any limitations you may have, and any unique swing tendencies you already have developed.

Golf is an individual expression of how you move athletically. It is an art form, not a science. Taking lessons can be extremely valuable, especially from any of the instructors with the Malaska Golf Academy at Las Sendas. Let them help you un-complicate the game and get the most out of your practice.



# Snowbirds Will Be Flocking This Year

hile the long hot summer is the one drawback to living in Arizona, even that's nothing to complain about when you consider it is our worst time of the year.

Unlike just about everyone else whose worst time is the winter, we

don't have to shovel snow, scrape ice off the windshield with our fingernails, or take 45 minutes getting dressed in layers and a Michelin Man suit just to step outside. Our worst time of the year really isn't that hard to take.

As our summer begins to fade and we head into the fall, we become the envy of everyone else. Let's face it, it's the reason we all live here in Arizona. As the Baby Boomer generation continues to age, snowbird numbers are likely to grow. ### WHY NOW IS A GOOD TIME TO SELL YOUR HOME



We usually see an increase in active listings from August through November. However, this year, active listings from August have increased at the lowest rate we have seen since 2001. August this year saw 15.6 percent fewer new listings than last year, and 13.2 percent fewer than August 2012, the previous low record holder.

# Your child's first visit to the dentist CAN BE A POSITIVE EXPERIENCE

hen should my child have his first dental exam? How often should he see the dentist? Are baby teeth really that important?

While most parents ask themselves these questions when their children are young, unfortunately, many do not know the answers or perhaps do not feel they are important enough to know.

In recognition of this problem, and to increase awareness about dental health needs for children, the American Dental Association (ADA) has launched the *First Dental Visit by Age 1* campaign.

When asked about the campaign, Dr. Farnsworth said, "Parents often do not bring their children in for a visit until there is a problem, such as a toothache. By that time, irreversible damage to the child's teeth may have already occurred," he continued. "I am glad to see the ADA is getting out in front of the problem by educating the public on the importance of oral health care for children."

The goal of this ADA campaign is to encourage parents to bring their children in for their first dental visit after their first tooth erupts and before their first birthday. The ADA also recommends each child see the dentist twice a year for check-ups and cleanings.

Dr. Farnsworth asked, "Do we think a child will have cavities when the first tooth comes in the mouth?

"No," he said in response to his question, "but this time allows us to answer any question a mother or a father may have regarding the child's dental health. It also is the time to begin relieving any stress or tension related to seeing the dentist, both for the parents and the child."

According to Dr. Farnsworth, check-ups for young children give both parents and dental professionals the opportunity to discuss the dental needs of children. Dentists can educate parents on proper brushing tech-



niques and dietary practices, which can make lasting habits for a lifetime.

Many problems can be avoided if caught early, such as baby bottle tooth decay, caries, primary herpetic simplex viral breakouts and speech pathology related to being tongue-tied. Many other conditions or concerns can be addressed by routine visits to the dentist.

"Preventative check-ups also provide the child an opportunity to have many positive experiences with a dentist,"

Dr. Farnsworth said. "These visits will help reduce the fear and anxiety children commonly associate with dental visits and promote better oral health, both now as children and later in life as adults."

Parents often do not understand the importance of baby teeth. The ADA has stated, "Baby teeth are as important as permanent teeth." Although baby teeth are lost between the ages of 6 and 12 years old, they serve an important role in the development of the child. Baby teeth are important for the child's speech development and to maintain space for permanent adult teeth. Early loss of baby teeth can compromise a child's speech and delay eruption of adult teeth. This delay can lead to crowding of the adult teeth when they finally erupt. This crowding is due to movement of the remaining teeth into the space of the lost teeth.

A child's health and well-being can be greatly affected by attitudes toward oral health care. "I love to see children in my practice," Dr. Farnsworth said. "It gives me the opportunity to help develop important habits and relationships they can continue for the rest of their lives, which ensures better overall health and quality of life."







"I have been thinking about this invention since I was a little girl out camping with my four older brothers," she explained. "Then, the idea resurfaced while I served in the Army. Being a rare female among many men, I realized this was needed every day while out in the field."

Kim was adamant about her project."I wanted to design something that would give military personnel and outdoor enthusiasts back their dignity of not having to undress in awkward or challenging outdoor environments," she stated. "The final push came when my son Zach came back from clearing IEDs from the roadsides of Afghanistan, and told me, 'All soldiers need a pair of these."" So, for the last two years, Kim has been refining her design, and has a patent pending on her unique sport shorts, which unzip in the middle using an attached pull cord. They are a stylish unisex design, which can be worn as shorts, swim pants or an undergarment. Right now they only are available in black and olive green, but Kim plans neons, metallics, hunter orange, camouflage and a variety of patterns. She also has designs for long pants and other items. "Kimbos are made in the USA," Kim stated proudly.

comfort, with a soft, one-inch cotton knit, elastic waistband.

- The nylon coil zipper has an internal fly, doubled over with material, to keep the zipper from contacting the body.
- The pull cord has a Velcro end, so it stays attached and won't get lost. It pulls like a surfing wetsuit to open and close.
- Grip elastic on the inside of leg openings keeps the shorts from riding up.
- An external pocket on the lower leg is perfect to hold a cell phone, ID, tissues or whatever.

"Another light bulb moment was seeing a Swiffer commercial with the dad who has only one arm," Kim explained."I realized the difficulty of dressing oneself, and started introducing Kimbos to physical therapists and orthopedic clinics." With their input, she now is working on apparel specially tailored for the needs of those who may have a temporary or permanent disability. During the summer, Kim and her 18-year-old daughter Michellie made a sales trip throughout the Midwest to fishing tournaments. They offered their unique garments to professional females who fish and had to spend all day in a small boat. The resulting acceptance was resounding and definitely understandable. Kim and her daughter also attended outdoor events and visited physical therapy clinics. A clinic representative was so excited about Kimbos, she said, "You are going to change so many lives." Kim depends on her daughter's expertise."By having my daughter with me to watch, budget and negotiate the roadmap helps her develop important skills most young girls never learn," she said. "Most vacation stories are about dreamy, languid days. Mine was about hard work, being a mom, and taking an idea from my brain to fruition."





Kim and Marty, who have suffered






