Hit and Swing for the Cure Events COMBINE TO WIN TOP AWARD

he annual tennis and golf fund-raising event at Red Mountain Ranch, for the Relay for Life (American Cancer Society-East Valley), went way over the top of last year's record \$23,000, and the total sum is still being counted.

Co-Chair Judy Smee still is pumped up from the bustling excitement of a record-breaking day at the Hit for the Cure. "We had a fabulous turnout," Judy said, "but nobody expected this kind of smash hit. Much credit goes to a couple of anonymous donors from our membership."

On this 14th Hit for the Cure, the Red Mountain organizers once again provided a splendid day full of jovial activities. Tennis Director Ray Kheshvadjian, at the heart of this fund-raiser, propelled the tournament with his trademark smile and many a friendly word.

"Ray gets up at 3 o'clock in the morning and puts his whole soul into the event," Judy said. "We have about 20

people on the committee who are doing a fabulous job. Fund raising is a lot of work, but when the results are so amazing, it is all worth it."

At the registration desk, Sheridan Skarda helped Stan Binder sell raffle tickets. Busy volunteers checked in the players. Photos of Red Mountain members who had experienced cancer were displayed on a poster board. And the colorful ribbons along the tablecloth listed the names of survivors—Wendy, Sue, Joan, Pat, Judy, and many others.

What Red Mountain residents Jan Edson and Gisela Munro, both breast cancer survivors, started 14 years ago, with former tennis director Tom Davis, has become a successful campaign to hit back at cancer. These players care a lot about each other. That's why they always work harder to raise more money.

"It is the goal of the American Cancer Society to eradicate cancer before the next century," said Lyn Gorton, from the Relay For Life of Mesa. He spent a whole day advocating to *finish the fight* among the cheerful camaraderie with his top team.

Gisela and Bill Munro collected a record \$5,375 for the wall donations. At \$5,000 each, two anonymous donors made contributions. Add the Ladies Golf Association's \$4,500, from the Swing for the Cure, the Men's Golf proceeds, the court sponsorships and auction—many sections still are being added up.

The Live Auction, under Ray's expert tutelage, wowed everybody. Renee Knorr and Carmen Atherstone had gathered about 80 items for bidding. Local merchants

generously contributed pamper baskets and gift cards. Artist Dyana Hesson donated a framed print.

"Ray has mastered the live auction technique," Wendy Skarda said in praise of the tennis coach. "He makes it so much fun." Bidding fever escalated over a privately hosted Spanish paella dinner for eight. Another war broke out over a Big Sky (Montana) vacation package. So, the condo owner donated a second vacation. Nobody went empty-handed.

To end this fantastic event on the highest note, Lyn awarded the Red Mountain Ranch crew the Top Fundraising Team plaque (wandering trophy). He said he had never witnessed a more enthusiastic and dedicated group.

With such high spirit, the musical duet Chardonnay, with Sheridan Skarda and Tanner Siegfort, finally released the celebratory community from the hard bidding work. Chord on Blue played for the partygoers into the night.

It was, however, Sheridan's mother Wendy who coined the new battle hymn. "At this rate," she said, "we are going to cure cancer." Yeah. Good work, Red Mountain Ranch Team.

Red Mountain Ranch Residents Deserve Thanks for Great Garage Sale

Many residents took part in the sale by selling unwanted items on their driveways. The community was filled with buyers looking for bargains on both days. Some came out as early as 5:30 a.m., before sunrise, to be the first to find good buys.

Many sellers did quite well, earning extra dollars for items no longer wanted. One participant decided to sell his late model Toyota along with household goods. He sold the car for \$22,000 at the sale, and believes the \$15 fee was the best investment he ever made.

The Red Mountain Ranch Social Club sponsors the community garage sale, which celebrated its 25th anniversary this year. The \$15 fee from the sellers pays for banners advertising the sale at the five entrances to North and South Red Mountain Ranch; sandwich board signs at major intersections; hand-out packets with maps, signs, sale instructions, and sale announcements; announcements in the *Up Close* newspaper; email announcements; and Internet advertising.

The sale provides one stop shopping for buyers who come to our community of 1,680 homes, and walk from one driveway to another to buy bargains. They don't have

to drive all over town to go to one garage sale. We hold the sale each November. Plan to join the sale next year. Look for our announcements starting next September.



PATIENT WONDERS WHY SHE HAS HIGH BL

r. Afroze Ahmad is happy to address the questions presented by her patients, and she explains her approach to providing answers in the following article.



HEALTHY LIFESTYLE

Last week, I had an unusual request from a new patient. The patient, Ms. Karen Adam, had set up an appointment to see me, as she wanted an answer to her question. Generally, in my cardiology practice, appointments are made for bodily or emotional complaints, second opinions, blood pressure issues, weight issues, leg and arm pain, numbness or tingling, palpitations, unexplained fatigue, sweating and dizziness.

Patients also come for evaluation of heart and stroke risks, family history of heart disease and its impact on them, as well as for medication and cholesterol concerns.

On that Monday morning, as I walked into the exam room, I met with a pleasant lady, in her late 40s, displaying an ideal weight for her height and age. As we started talking, my way of indirectly obtaining medical history, it was apparent, my patient, Karen, believed that not only was she health conscious in terms of what she ate and drank, but she also was diligent with her physical activity.

She informed me she ran five miles daily. Karen also conveyed to me that her healthy lifestyle did not stop with her. She also utilized healthy choices in foods and meal

planning for her family of five, including husband and three sons in high school.

HERE COMES THE QUESTION

Then, Karen blurted out her question. "Doctor, why do I have high blood pressure? My blood pressure is almost always around 130/80 mm of Hg." She appeared visibly upset. When I inquired as to what has triggered the emotional irritation, she promptly replied "My lifestyle should have protected me from high blood pressure."

QUESTION IS BOTH VALID AND APPROPRIATE

I replied, "Karen, your question is both valid and appropriate. However, to answer your question, we have to revisit several features and issues in your history and lifestyle."

CAUSES OF HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE

Although, the precise cause of high blood pressure has not been established as of yet, there are several causes and factors, which predispose us to high blood pressure. The causes include both mutable and immutable.

The mutable or changeable factors besides being overweight include smoking, excessive snoring, emotional response to stress, absence of physical activity, more than one to two alcohol drinks per day, salt-rich food and use of non-steroidal anti-inflammatory agents such as Motrin, Aleve and Advil.

The immutable or permanent causes of high blood pressure include family history of high blood pressure, hormonal imbalance and kidney disease.

In Karen's case, an in-depth interview did reveal that despite a healthy lifestyle, there were hidden risk factors present. High salt consumption was one, as she was using both canned vegetables and canned broth or bouillon

cubes to prepare her healthy meals. Canned and cured food is rich in salt.

Also, remember, Karen is an avid runner. She shared with me her running leads to generalized aches and pains for which she takes painkillers. Karen took an average of four tablets of anti-inflammatory drugs almost on a daily basis.

By the end of our visit, Karen had opened up and said, "We usually have two cocktails before dinner and two glasses of wine with dinner." During her visit, by simply reflecting and being cognizant of our conversation, Karen was able to uncover her high blood pressure culprits of increased salt consumption, increased alcohol consumption and use of non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs.

MORALE OF THE STORY

Lifestyle patterns affect our health, both favorably and adversely. The power and impact of lifestyle changes should not be overlooked. Given Karen's dedication and diligence, she has opted to pursue lifestyle changes by decreasing her salt and alcohol consumption and walking only briskly to avoid both aches and pains and increased use of non-steroidal anti-inflammatory agents.

Karen will follow up with me in 15 weeks to assess her blood pressure response to lifestyle changes. Generally, the effect of lifestyle changes is apparent in 12 weeks. For Karen, the three-week bonus is to cheat a little during the upcoming holidays. ■

JOHN'S GRILLED LAMB CHOPS

Serves 8 to 10 Calls for 5 packages of lamb racks. (Costco usually has these in stock.)

Marinade

8 cloves garlic

3 sprigs fresh rosemary

4 sprigs fresh thyme

1 1/2 cups extra virgin olive oil Juice of one lemon

2 tablespoons balsamic vinegar

1/2 teaspoon salt and 1/2 teaspoon fresh ground pepper

Trim as much fat from the lamb as possible without separating the lamb from the bone. Slice rack into individual

chops. Follow the bones on the backside of the rack. You will see the spot where you can cut between them. Use a sharp knife to get a clean cut.

Place all the lamb chops in 9-by-12 pans, with the bones facing the same direction.

Combine all the marinade ingredients in a blender. Pour marinade over the lamb meat. Cover and marinate overnight.

When ready to serve

Prepare a hot charcoal or gas grill. Remove chops from marinade, and season with salt and pepper. Grill chops for 2 to 3 minutes per side, or until they are medium to medium rare. Platter and garnish with thyme and rosemary sprigs.

BUTTERNUT SQUASH AND ARUGULA SALAD

Serves 8

Salad

1 bag prewashed baby arugula

3 cups peeled and cubed butternut squash (Trader Joe's has precut butternut squash in packages. Use 2 packages.) 2 large beets, roasted and cubed (Trader Joe's has preroasted beets in packages. Use 2 packages.)

1/2 cup fresh pomegranate seeds

3/4 cup crumbled goat cheese (optional)

1 teaspoon Dijon mustard 1/4 cup real maple syrup 1/4 cup lemon juice 1/3 cup olive oil

Roast the butternut squash

Preheat the oven to 375 degrees. Peel, seed and cube 1 medium butternut squash. Toss squash with 3 tablespoons of olive oil and 1 teaspoon of fine sea salt. Roast on a sheet pan until tender. Note: The butternut squash can be made

up to one day in advance.

To roast the beets Clean the beets, and pierce several times with a knife. Wrap each beet in aluminum foil,



and place on a foil-lined sheet pan. Roast

at 375 degrees until beets can be easily pierced with a paring knife. Let beets cool, remove foil, peel and cube. Note: The beets can be made up to one day in advance.

Dressing

Whisk Dijon mustard, maple syrup, lemon juice and olive oil together. Set aside. The dressing can be made two days in advance.


To assemble salad

Use a medium to large platter. Spread arugula on the bottom, top with butternut squash (allowing the arugula to peak out around the sides). Place beets in a stripe across the top of the butternut squash, scatter with pomegranate seeds, and crumbled chèvre, if desired. Can be put on a platter and covered with plastic wrap the morning of your event. Drizzle with dressing when ready to serve.



None of the girls had heard of them or knew what they were. So, of course, I had to spend the next 30 minutes telling them all about the crackers and what fun they are. Now, all the girls in the office are heading to the stores to start making Christmas crackers part of their family tradition.

So, what are they? Created by Tom Smith, in 1847, the crackers are cardboard tubes covered in brightly colored twisted paper. When the cracker is pulled by two people, each holding one end of the twisted paper, the friction creates a small pop, which is produced by a narrow strip of chemically treated paper. The cardboard tube contains a brightly colored paper hat (which I make everyone wear, whether they want to or not), a small gift and a motto or joke.

Christmas crackers have been a tradition for the English Christmas dinner since their inception. Even the

royal family will have a Christmas cracker adorning their Christmas dinner table. Being from England, I had to carry on the tradition for my family here in America. I used to have to get them shipped in from England, but now they can be found everywhere, from Costco, to World Market and Bed Bath and Beyond, as well as many other stores.

You can get very expensive ones, which will have better gifts, or you even can make your own, using a

toilet paper tube and colored paper. Then, you can put your own gifts inside, and even make them specific for each guest, if you are that adventurous.

The crackers are not only a lot of fun, but the jokes usually are so corny you can't help but laugh. They really decorate the dinner table, too, and the kids love the novelty gifts inside. We pull our crackers as soon as we all sit at the table before we eat (watch out for flying gifts), and then go around the table telling the jokes throughout the meal. For us Britts, Christmas just isn't Christmas without them.

So, next time you are at the store and see these brightly colored crackers, buy a box, and start a new family tradition. I would love to hear from anyone who tries them







It Is Important to Be CAR CARE AWARE

o one can function without a vehicle these days, so follow these simple guidelines to see how easy car maintenance can be.

- 1. Change the oil every 3,000 miles. Sure, the manufacturers and oil companies say you can go much longer intervals, but they don't have to pay for the repairs. You do. Changing your oil and filter every 3,000 miles will keep the engine cleaner, and also will avoid sludge and containment build-up inside your engine. It also is recommended to have the oil system flushed every 12,000 miles to further extend the life of your engine.
- 2. Change the other fluids on your car at or before the recommended service schedule found in your owner's manual. Just like the engine oil, these fluids only will protect your car's other systems if maintained properly. Many power steering and transmission repairs can be avoided if the fluid is changed at the proper interval.
- **3.** Do not ignore warning lights. There are multiple warnings, which can appear on the instrument cluster. They can be as simple as a low tire pressure indicator, or as crucial as an engine operating temperature indicator. Never continue to drive a car while the engine is overheating. In any case, always find out why the light is on every time. Just because you see the same light, it doesn't mean it is on for the same reason as the last time.
- **4.** Have your car repaired in a timely manner. Putting off a known needed repair easily can turn into a much larger one if not dealt with proactively. A brake squeal,



which indicates pads need to be replaced, turns into a brake grind, and now there is damage to rotors and calipers. A cooling hose leak can turn into an overheated engine and cause expensive damage. When faced with multiple repairs at once, prioritize them so you do not feel overwhelmed.

5. Always use the same facility, if possible, for all your car service needs. Once you find a place with which you are comfortable, keep going there. It is easier to keep track of your service records when they are in one place, even when all you need is an oil change. A full service facility will give you a report on the condition of your entire vehicle. This will help avoid future surprise repairs.

Hope inspires students at SHARP School

7 hile hope comes in many forms, for the students at SHARP School, it is in the wisdom of a 6-year-old goldendoodle — a therapy dog named Hope — and her handler Pam Reinke.

Hope is one of several pet therapy dogs from Gabriel's Angels that visit the school on a rotating schedule several times a month. SHARP is part of Mesa Public Schools, servicing the special education community, from kindergarten through 12th grade. Its students are at different stages in their emotional development, and the dogs are able to connect with the students.

"The dogs teach our students the same things we work on each day, but in a different way," Cathy Weigler, school counselor at SHARP, explained. "The kids respond to the dogs without behaviors because it's all non-verbal. Therefore, learning becomes intrinsic. Students develop relationships with the dogs, fostering trust and unconditional positive regard. During therapy sessions, seven core behaviors are targeted. They are attachment, confidence, self-regulation, affiliation, awareness, tolerance and respect."

The therapy dogs and their handlers meet with groups of 10 or fewer students, for 30 minutes, every other week. The time includes an activity like brushing the dogs, reading stories, listening to the dog's heartbeat, brushing the dog's

teeth, learning pet first aid and other practical skills.

"Students are motivated to do well because they know the dogs are coming back. And they love spending time with the dogs." Cathy stated.

TEACHING STUDENTS ABOUT OVERCOMING ADVERSITY

This past January, Hope was in a car accident and almost died. She pulled through, but lost her left rear leg. Students shed tears and wrestled with emotions when they heard about Hope's accident. They learned about empathy, and expressed their thoughts on hand-written cards.

"Hope would smell the cards from the students," Pam recalled. "She would look at me with that 'When do we get to go back to school?' look she associates with the scent of our visiting bag."

Hope and Pam returned to school three weeks after the accident. With a gentle touch, students ran their fingers through Hope's soft fur with the most love that they could find in their hearts, taking extra care to avoid touching the incision. Curious about the injury, they peppered the handler with questions like, "Will her leg grow back?" or "What did they do with her leg?"

"We explained that her leg was in the place where they put all legs that are broken," Pam said.

Self-identifying with Hope's injuries, the students relayed stories and statements of their own illnesses or issues, bringing them to the forefront. They felt a sense of ownership and responsibility for their pal Hope.

To commemorate the special year, Gabriel's Angels made clay paw imprints for each student.

When asked how pet therapy dogs make a difference in the lives of these students, Pam said, "The last thing I heard when the students were given Hope's paw print was, 'I know that no matter what might happen to me, I can get through it because of what Hope has been through. If she can do all she does with three legs, I can handle anything." ■




