■ he Life Balance Center, an integrated health and wellness center, will be opening soon at the Las Sendas Office Building.

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

## MARRIED COUPLE SEEKS PROFESSIONAL

This is the third and last article in the series of why, what and how of blood pressure.

#### **CAN I IMPROVE MY OUTCOMES FOR HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE?**

While my practice has a large percentage of couples, they may not choose to share the same exam room with each other during a

clinic visit, but generally share many of the same diseases.

So, when Maria and George Taylor requested a same-day and same-time appointment, it surprised me. Talking to them later, in the exam room, it was apparent the Taylors were committed to their New Year's resolution to improve their outcomes with high blood pressure.

#### **HE SNORES, AND DRIVES ME CRAZY**

To achieve their New Year's resolution, we started with non-medical strategies.

"Doctor, you recommend 30 minutes of physical activity five times a week, and I easily can do it in the morning, once the kids are off to school," Maria said. "However, George snores all night long, which renders me sleepless and groggy in the morning, with no desire to exercise."

George interjected, "Really? Do I really snore heavily?" Snoring is no longer just a cause for divorce. Snoring and other altered breathing patterns during sleep have been associated with increased risk of heart problems, including irregular heartbeat, high blood pressure, stroke and even sudden death. Just as exercise drops the blood pressure by four to nine points, treatment for sleep disorders also helps with improving blood pressure readings.

#### **EATING PLAN**

"Healthy eating is such a cliché, and it certainly does not

help me with my grocery shopping," said Maria. "Is there a better cheat sheet to use for meal planning?"

I can understand the frustration in her voice.

Nutrition is vital for both prevention and treatment of high blood pressure. Meal planning should comprise of the mindful and dedicated reduction in saturated fats, sugars and cholesterol-rich foods. At the same time, incorporating fruits, nuts, whole grains and vegetables would result in the drop of blood pressure by eight to 14 points.

"Pizza and cheese are the major sources of saturated fats at our dining table," I informed the couple. "Meal planning with two days of vegan dishes would go a long way in favorable outcomes with blood pressure. The best way to plan or consume a vegan diet is to hold or look at the food about to be consumed, and always ask yourself, 'Did this food ever have a mama?' If the answer is yes, it is not vegan," I said.

"That will be easy," Maria said. "With George being a Cuban American, we eat beans three to four times a week."

"That is great," I added, "as long as the beans are not eaten with sour cream."

With a twinkle in her eye, Maria said, "I get it. Sour cream comes from a mama. So, I will be careful."

#### **SALT INTAKE**

George complained that salt prudence or salt restrictions are general terms, and he wished for some precise guidance. An easy way to remember is one-quarter of a teaspoonful is equal to 600 mg of salt. An intake of 2,400 mg is a good target, which means the total salt intake of both cooked and uncooked food should not exceed one teaspoon.

"Wow, I never knew this fact," said Maria.

Adhering to salt intake of one teaspoon or less can drop the blood pressure by four to eight points.

#### **WEIGHT LOSS**

I reminded both Maria and George of the fact their weight loss also is going to help them lower their blood pressure. George asked, "When and what kind of results are we

I informed him, for every 20 pounds of weight loss, the blood pressure drops by seven to 20 points.

#### **STRESS REDUCTION**

Anxiety at work, home or in any interpersonal relationship may adversely affect blood pressure. Utilizing stress busters like yoga, breathing exercises and acupuncture, if supervised by a physician, would drop the blood pressure by five points.

#### **ALCOHOL CONSUMPTION**

"I am no champagne George, but I still would like to know the alcohol limits, and the impact on blood pressure,"

As long as the alcohol intake is restricted to no more than seven drinks a week, I told him the drop in blood pressure is two to four points.

#### **TOBACCO**

Maria has been a winner so far, with a complete exclusion of tobacco for the past eight months. I informed her that her cessation will help drop her blood pressure by three to five points.

Our clinic visit was coming to an end. I summarized the various interventions, including exercise, salt, alcohol, diet, weight reduction, and stress busters, and their effects on blood pressure.

"By profession, I am an accountant," George added. "I have summed up all the points. To me, it looks like by Halloween of this year, I would drop my blood pressure by 33 to 45 points."

Maria smiled, gave him a high-five, and said, "Me, too." ■

Staff members also learn to help dogs feel comfortable in a new environment. They also are trained in pet first aid and pet CPR.

Evaluating dogs is required for all dogs boarding overnight or enjoying doggy daycare at Happy Pets Palace.

All dogs must be current on rabies, distemper, bordetella, neutered/spayed once of age, and free of flea/tick and other transferable diseases. All accepted dogs have passed a four-hour pre-screening interview process, showing they are a good fit for an off-leash dog-dog group environment.

Dogs of any breed showing aggressive tendencies are not allowed. Happy Pets evaluates each dog individually based on the dog's greeting style and stress signals, as well as dog body language around other dogs. A dog passing Happy Pets pre-screening will display relaxed signals around other dogs, and have balanced play style, being loose or curvy in their movements.






rizona's 2015 Teacher of the Year is John-David Bowman, who hails from Westwood High School, where he has been an educator for eight years.

### SELF DEVELOPMENT ACADEMY IS A **Unique Elementary and Middle School**

or the past decade, Self Development Academy **◄** (SDA) is the only Arizona school consistently ranked among the top 10 schools by the Arizona Department of Education.

How has SDA attained this ranking and received other prestigious awards, including the 2010 Charter School of the Year Award, from the Arizona Charter Schools Association and Academic Excellence Award (2011)?

The success of SDA students is attributed to a visionary principal, dedicated teachers, administration and staff, supportive families and motivated students.

More than 14 years ago, Dr. Anjum Majeed founded SDA, after much encouragement from parents desiring a continuation of the advanced, and high-level preschool and kindergarten curriculums offered at Self Development Preschool. The small group pull-out model is used to provide enrichment opportunities for excelling students, as well.

By the time SDA students reach middle school, many are prepared to enroll in Algebra I, Advanced Literature and Advanced Science. During middle school, students have the opportunity to complete Pre-Algebra, Algebra I, Geometry, and Algebra II, Advanced Literature, Science including Biology, Chemistry and Physics, Technology and Spanish. Many of these courses are not offered until high school.

Students completing eighth grade at SDA are enrolled in Honors and Advanced Placement courses upon entering high school. Additionally, many students receive high school credit for courses completed at SDA. This enhances their grade point averages, and makes them highly competitive students when applying to colleges and universities.

Aside from the academic focus, students have opportunities to develop other skills, such as public speaking, sports and performance skills. Class plays, winter performances and the science fair are just a few of the many annual in-house activities. Afterschool activities include Sports Club, Robotics, Foreign Language, Dance Club, Choir Club and Student Government. SDA is committed to developing wellrounded students who are well prepared for high school and beyond. ■



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## TAKE ADVANTAGE OF ALL OF YOUR REAL ESTATE TAX DEDUCTIONS

s you prepare your 2014 taxes, here are some ways your home can help you reduce your tax liability, and if your aren't a homeowner yet, consider these great reasons to consider adding homeownership to your list of goals for 2015.



#### **MORTGAGE INTEREST**

Did you know Americans save about \$100 million in taxes annually from mortgage insurance deductions? In the U.S., homeowners can deduct the interest paid on mortgage balances up to \$1 million and the interest paid on home equity loan or second mortgage balances up to \$100,000. The greatest tax benefit is felt in the first few years of the loan, when the payments are comprised almost entirely of interest.

#### PRIVATE MORTGAGE INSURANCE

Homeowners who have less than 20 percent equity in their mortgage must typically pay for private mortgage insurance (PMI). PMI is deductible on personal residences and vacations homes, but not rentals. This deduction only is available if the head of household, married couple filing jointly, or single earner's adjusted gross income is less than \$109,000. This provision was set to expire in 2014, but was renewed in the last weeks of the year into 2015.

#### **MORTGAGE POINTS**

Did you buy a new home this year? When originating loans, lenders can charge borrowers points, or percentagebased fees in exchange for lower interest rates. Each point equals 1 percent of the entire amount of the loan. For example, on a \$100,000 loan, 1 point would cost \$1,000. If you paid points on a new home purchase, they are deductible in the year they were paid. Points paid on a home equity loan or to refinance also are deductible, but only over the life of the loan.

#### **REAL ESTATE TAXES**

For most homeowners with mortgages, property taxes are collected as part of monthly mortgage payments, placed in an impound account, and then paid by the lender as they are due. Homeowners may deduct the amount of tax actually paid out by the lender to the municipalities. New homeowners can deduct the full amount of property taxes paid upfront at closing.

#### **ENERGY UPGRADES**

If you made energy-efficient upgrades, you may be able to claim a percentage of the cost up to \$500 in tax credits. These tax credits are cumulative, so if you claimed \$400 worth of upgrades in 2013, you would only be able to claim \$100 in 2014. Eligible upgrades include the upgrade of exterior windows, heating and cooling systems, insulation and exterior doors. Separate tax credits also are available on geothermal heat pumps, solar water heaters, solar panels, fuel cells and small wind-energy systems. Each item is deductible at a different level (and with restrictions). So, do your research.

#### **SHORT SALES**

If you decided to short-sell your home last year, you may benefit from the Mortgage Forgiveness Debt Relief Act. The act forgives up to \$2 million worth of debt for qualifying individuals. Without the Mortgage Forgiveness Debt Relief Act, the IRS would see forgiven loans as taxable income by the IRS. Congress renewed this act in late December of this past year to cover short sales in 2014. Short-selling a home in 2015 is more of a gamble. If Congress doesn't renew the act, those who do a short sale will have to pay taxes on the forgiven debt.

#### **EXCLUSIONS ON GAINS FROM SALES**

If you lived in your primary residence for two of the last five years, you are eligible for an exclusion on the net sales gain of your home up to \$250,000 for an individual and \$500,000 for a couple. The net sales gain is the selling price less the purchase price, plus any improvements and selling expenses.


#### **VACATION/SECOND HOMES**

Mortgage interest payments and property taxes are deductible on second homes. So, too, are other business expenses on rental properties. According to Certified Public Accountant Michael Schulman, "You can't deduct your own homeowner's insurance [on a primary residence], but you can deduct it on a rental property." The same is true for costs for pool service, gardening or maintenance charges for a co-op.

## 2015 IS OFF TO A GOOD STA

**→** he Phoenix housing market for 2014 was uneventful and pretty slow, with low supply but even lower demand.

December's median sales price for Mesa increased 5.95 percent over January 2014. However, the peak for 2014 was in July, with a median sales price of \$197,900. December's median sales price of \$196,000 is down 1 percent from the summer's peak.

2014 ended out on a high note with December sales ending stronger than expected with more than 11 percent increase over December 2013, which is a good way to start the New Year, and just one of the signs the market may be shifting in the seller's favor. While the buyers still have a slight edge, with more supply than demand, the margin is thinning. There is a clear trend it is moving against them and heading in favor of the sellers. Supply decreased more than normal for December, and demand is showing some signs of life again, after being well below normal in 2014.

December luxury home sales soared. As a result, it was the best December since 2006, with 109 closed transactions across Greater Phoenix for homes priced at \$1 million and above. This was an increase of 10 percent over December 2013.

#### **INDICATORS SHOW 2015 COULD BE A STRONG SELLERS MARKET**

Mortgage applications made big moves recently, increasing 49.1 percent from one week earlier, and showcasing the largest jump since November 2008, according to data from the Mortgage Bankers Association's (MBA) Weekly Mortgage Applications Survey for the week ending Jan. 9.

January 2015 Greater Phoenix—In the first two weeks of January, there was a lower than average number

of new listings coming on the market, and there was less supply than December. So far, we have the lowest number of active listings year to date since we started counting in 2000. Demand has started to increase. As of Jan. 15, supply and demand were almost balanced at 83.3 and 82.5 respectively. The key is going to be what will happen with supply and demand over the next few months. With supply already well below normal, and, if demand returned quickly to normal, sellers will regain the advantage, and prices could start to see some upward pressure building again.

#### **NEW LENDING INCENTIVES HELP HOMEBUYERS IN 2015**

FHA Reduced Mortgage Insurance Premiums—The Federal Housing Administration (FHA) has reduced its annual mortgage insurance premium (MIP) by 0.5 percentage point, from 1.35 percent to 0.85 percent. This was effective on Jan. 26. According to the White House Fact Sheet on this announcement, this reduction will translate into an average savings of \$900 annually on their mortgage payment. Existing homeowners who refinance into an FHA mortgage will see similar reductions to their mortgage payments, as well. Here is an example of how much this will save each month in the first year on a \$250,000 loan.

#### Example:

- Current MI rate 1.35 percent (\$250,000 x 1.35)/12 = \$281.25 monthly MI
- New MI Rate 0.85 percent (\$250,000 x .8 percent)/12 = \$177.08 monthly MI

The new rate will reduce the FHA homebuyer's monthly mortgage insurance by \$104 per month on a \$250,000 average loan amount. That is like giving a buyer another \$20K to \$25K in purchasing power.



#### Down Payment Conventional Loan of 3 Percent—

Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac announced, in December, the return of the 3 percent down payment loan. However, it is only for first time homebuyers. A first time homebuyer is considered a buyer who has not had ownership in a home in at least the past three years. It does not, however, have to be the buyer's first home.

- Down payment—3 percent
- Minimum Credit Score—620
- First Time Homebuyer Requirement—Yes
- Occupancy—Must be primary residence

The consensus of the analysts and several key indicators are all heading in the direction for 2015 to be a stronger year than 2014, and for the market to shift from being a buyer's market to a seller's market. At the time of writing this article, however, we were only two weeks into January, so it is too early to know for sure. Only time will tell, but it's sure looking good. ■

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




## There Is a Way to Roll Your 401(k)

### Over To A Traditional IRA

You may be tempted to keep some or all of the money instead of rolling it over, but that is rarely a good idea. If you cash out your 401(k) plan balance, you generally pay the income taxes due on the entire amount withdrawn, as well as a 10 percent penalty tax, unless you are at least 59 1/2 years old, or unless you are retiring from your employer at age 55 or older.

If, however, you want to keep the money in place for retirement, a good strategy to consider is rolling the funds over into an Individual Retirement Account, or IRA.

#### THE PROCESS IS SIMPLE

Find an IRA investment (such as a fixed



annuity, a bank CD or a mutual fund) appropriate for you. You will need to meet with me, or with your financial professional, to determine the options right for you.

Contact the administrator of your former employer's plan. Request the necessary forms be sent to you, so you can make the rollover. (I'll help you fill out

The funds will arrive in your IRA for investment as you chose in step 1.

#### A WORD OF CAUTION

The administrator may require the check be mailed to you. Make sure the check is made payable to the new IRA company, and For Benefit of (FBO) your name (Example: State Farm FBO Donna Kohlhase). If the check is made payable to you, the plan administrator will have to withhold 20 percent of the distributable amount for federal income taxes. There is no tax due now on this rollover. So, don't pay it. ■

## **Determine the source of your** car's noise and stay safe

Then your car starts making a

strange noise, it usually is an indication a repair is needed. Noises can range from clicks, clunks, grinds, moans and squeaks. If your car is making a sound it never made before, you should have it checked. Proactivity usually will keep the repair costs down, or, at least, you can determine the cost of the repair,

So, what can different noises mean? Unfortunately, the list is endless. The best choice is to have the vehicle inspected, and find out exactly what is causing your specific noise to happen. Most shops will perform an inspection for free, or a minimal charge.

and set a budget to have it fixed.

If your steering pump starts to make a whining noise, it most likely is due to a low fluid level. When the fluid level becomes low, you should have it checked for a leak. The steering system is made up of three major components, which are the pump, the gear and the lines. Any one of these can develop a leak. If the leak is not corrected in a timely manner, other steering components can be damaged, and the repair costs can go up dramatically.

A clunk in the suspension can be

as simple as a worn out rubber bushing. Every component in the suspension system uses bushings to hold it tight and allow the suspension to move. Due to our extreme temperatures, the rubber dry rots over time and starts to come apart. Replacing the bushings can alleviate the need to replace more expensive components in the future.

Brake noise is sometimes the hardest to eliminate. Grinding during braking is almost always an indication of worn out pads. However, squeaking can be anything from inferior pad material to road debris caught in the braking system. If your brakes are squeaking, have them inspected. Most service shops do brake inspections at
