## **Learning Continues from One Generation to Another**

young adult, with a preschooler in tow, recently came to Self Development Preschool requesting to talk to Ms. Vernetta Madsen, the director.

When Ms. Madsen, more fondly called Ms. Vernetta, entered the front lobby, the smiling young man asked if she recognized him.

"Of course, Ben," she said. Turning to the preschooler, she bent down and asked, "Whom do we have here?"

Ben was a former student at Self Development Preschool who joined the preschool at age 2. He later enrolled in its afterschool program until he reached the eighth grade. Each day, for nearly 12 years, his mother brought him to the school. Every day during this time, Ms. Vernetta and his teachers warmly welcomed him and cared for him in a nurturing way. Each day, Ben could not wait to come to school, and was unwilling to leave.

On this morning in November, Ben, now an adult, was extremely excited to come to Self Development Preschool. He was eager to have Ms. Vernetta meet his daughter and to enroll her at the school. He wanted his child to have the same wonderful experiences he had while attending the preschool as a student.

Ms. Vernetta proudly proclaims several of the former students of the preschool bring their children to Self Development Preschool. They also recommend nieces and nephews to attend the school. This all speaks volumes about the quality of care and consistency provided at this early childhood program.

When assessing the overall quality of an early child-hood program, Lilian Katz, a nationally renowned early childhood educator, identified five perspectives. These

are the child's perspective, the early childhood educator's perspective, the parents' perspective, the perspective of the administrators for licensing and supervision and the perspective of the community being served.

Experts agree the early childhood years are the most formative. During this period of the first five years of life, a substantial amount of learning and brain development takes place. The preschooler should feel accepted, respected and safe. The activities must be engaging, fun and challenging. Having a former student, such as Ben, enroll his child at the preschool is a testimony to his own positive experiences and the feeling of belonging and being accepted by the culture of Self Development Preschool.

At Self Development Preschool, children feel welcomed, loved and secure.

The second perspective identified was the teachers' perspective. It is rare when the same familiar faces eagerly greet children day after day and year after year. The caregivers at Self Development Preschool are committed to providing consistency in the lives of young children. As teachers, they are kind and caring, and as co-workers, they are supportive of each other. The low turnover of the staff provides for the development of a meaningful and secure relationship between the child, the caregiver, the parents and the school. Several teachers at the preschool have worked at Self Development for more than a decade. Ms. Vernetta has directed the school since 1991.

Parental perspective also is critical for assessing the quality of an early childhood program. Parental involvement is key for the success of Self Development. Serving as volunteers, the parents help at class parties, introduce the children to developing a love for reading, and arrange for fire trucks to visit the school, so children can learn about fire and safety. Parents participate in fund-raising events, making it *fun and games* to benefit the children's program. Parental support of the program becomes even more evident at the annual fall festival, which is attended by more than 500 people.

Another perspective for a quality early childhood program addresses how well prepared children are for kindergarten. Kindergarten teachers report most children attending Self Development Preschool are ready to follow directions, use critical thinking skills and excel in an accelerated kindergarten program, such as the one offered at Self Development Academy-Mesa.

Children attending Self Development Preschool become ready for kindergarten because the preschool curriculum focuses on cognitive, social, emotional and physical development. Children learn to compare and contrast, develop a love for reading, move to music and play with their friends.

Using the thematic approach, in the month of December, the preschool children celebrate holidays around the world. In January, they learn about animals and their habitats. In February, they learn about their bodies, and, with parents as visitors, they discuss the role of professionals in the health field.

Last month, I decided to spend some time with the preschoolers at Self Development. Ben's daughter was busy sorting different animals and matching them with their habitats.

The rigorous curriculum, with fun and engaging activities, prepares children at Self Development Preschool to succeed in kindergarten and beyond. ■

You may want to jump on Zillow or other real estate sites, but I urge you to hold off and get a market analysis from a local Realtor. While Zillow will quickly give you a value, their values are often way off, as they can only look at statistics, usually use a larger area from which to pull those statistics, and the data can be outdated. Our neighborhoods are very different here in East Mesa, and the values are skewed when the data is pulled from other neighborhoods.

There are many other factors affecting your home's value, which the computer cannot calculate, such as the upgrades you have, if you have a pool, location, views, golf course lots, single-story versus two-story homes and many

more. All these make a big difference in your home's value. If you do want to go online to get a quick value, you can get an accurate home estimate at InstantHomeValueAZ.com, which takes you to my website. I will personally run the report for you. ## This is the Ultimate Checklist for Traveling Abroad

raveling internationally is an adventure best planned ahead of time, and not just when it comes to booking flights and packing.

Showing up at your gate sans passport or forgetting to find out if a visa is needed for your destination can stop your

trip before it starts. However, most of your preparation should be dedicated to ensuring that health, safety and financial necessities are covered.

We have compiled this checklist for your next long-distance journey.

#### **SAFETY FIRST**

An easy and important pre-trip check is arguably the most ignored. Travel insurance and State Department alerts can be important in emergency situations abroad. Nevertheless, many tourists bet they won't become part of the small percentage of travelers requiring evacuation assistance or protection from hotel or flight cancellations.

Subscribing to the State Department's Smart Traveler Enrollment Program alerts for your destination early on may seem unnecessary, but emails about upcoming and current travel restrictions, strikes and areas of political unrest will include what to expect. Alerts will let you know whether or not to plan for unexpected obstacles.

Travel insurance can cost as little as a few dollars per travel day. It can cover anything from replacing a broken camera, to emergency medical attention, potentially saving you hundreds, maybe even thousands of dollars.

#### TRAVEL DOCUMENTS AND BANKING

Make sure your passport and any necessary travel visas are current. Most countries require a passport to be valid for at least six months after your scheduled return.

Keep physical and digital copies of your passport and all your paperwork in case anything is lost. Give copies, as well as your itinerary and contact numbers, to family and friends you can contact in an emergency.

Notify your bank and credit card companies about your travel dates, so they don't deny your purchases. Also, ask about international ATM fees, so you can determine which ones won't charge you. If you are a forgetful cardholder (or just want to be prepared in case your wallet is stolen), bring an un-activated credit or debit card in case you have to cancel the few you brought with you.

A cellphone photo of your passport can be helpful. Whether you have to go to the consulate and report it lost, or are just filling out a customs card and need your passport number, it likely will come in handy. Email the image to yourself to have an extra digital copy in case your phone battery runs out or your phone goes missing.

#### **GET VACCINATED**

It is best to get the necessary vaccinations as soon as possible. Some require multiple doses, which may need to be administered over days, weeks or even months. Talk to your doctor about getting the Centers for Disease Control-

recommended shots, as protocol for vaccines vary by country.

#### **STUDY UP**

Having some knowledge about your destination is invaluable. Read about the region you are traveling to in advance. This helps you gain insight into important information. From money conversion and useful phrases, to tipping, appropriate clothing and cultural/



legal customs, it is better to be prepared, so you don't land in a compromising situation.

#### **STAY CONNECTED**

Buy an international phone plan in advance. Unlock your phone, so you can make calls through a foreign carrier, or buy an international prepaid SIM card. If none of those sound ideal, or if you will be staying at your destination long term, research options for phone rentals or plans before leaving.

#### **DOWNLOAD THE NECESSITIES**

Sometimes, the most important thing you pack is in your smartphone rather than your suitcase. Offline maps are your best friends when it comes to traveling without access to cellular data. You can find Wi-Fi in some places, but downloaded Google Maps or CityMaps2Go will allow you to follow your GPS without using up battery life and roaming data.

- Anti-bacterial wipes
- Sweater/scarf for the cold plane
- Plastic bags
- Cameras/memory cards ■



solicitation, and not a Payment Due letter.




There are a lot of mail and phone scams targeting the elderly. If you did not initiate the call, or ask for information to be sent to you, be especially careful. Don't be afraid to ask someone else to look it over if you are not sure.

Mom was grateful for the second opinion, and I was glad she called. ■

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


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

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## Deep tissue laser therapy gets results

**7**ith more than 80 percent of the U.S. population experiencing some form of back pain over the course of their lifetimes, people want pain relief, and are desperate to improve their quality of life.



A growing number of progressive health care providers are giving them relief by using Class IV highpower deep-tissue laser therapy. Unfortunately, there is a plethora of misinformation regarding laser therapy, such as which type is best, how much to use (dosage), treatment frequency and even proper diagnostic procedures. Deep tissue laser therapy treatments are administered in five to 10 minutes. Typically, patients see results after three to five treatment sessions. amount of energy to a specified area (measured in J/cm2). Dosages are determined situationally based on numerous factors, including acuity, patient absorption characteristics and relative depth of the affected structure within the body.

The treatment length is dependent on the power of the laser, while the number of treatments is typically left up to the clinician's discretion and recommended protocols.



## Think About Sending Financial VALENTINES TO LOVED ONES

Submitted by Edward Jones ccording to the National Retail Federation, Americans spent nearly \$19 billion in Valentine's Day gifts last year, with much of this money spent on gifts with short shelf lives, such as candy, flowers and restaurant meals (and about \$700 million was spent on gifts for pets).

There's certainly nothing wrong with giving chocolates or roses. But this year, think about going beyond the classic gifts. Instead, use Valentine's Day as an opportunity to determine how you can make gifts with long-lasting impact to your circle of loved ones.

Here are some suggestions:



While Roth IRA contributions are not deductible, any earnings growth can be distributed tax free, provided the account owner doesn't take withdrawals until age 59, and has had the account at least five years. For 2015 and 2016, the IRA contribution limit is \$5,500, or \$6,500 for those age 50 or older.

For your children—You don't have to be rich to give your children a gift worth \$1 million—you just have to help them through school. College graduates earn about \$1 million more over their lifetimes than those without a degree, according to research from the Federal Reserve

Bank of New York. Still, college isn't cheap. The average annual cost—tuition, fees, room and board—for a private four-year college, is more than \$42,000, according to the College Board, while the comparable figure for a public four-year school is about \$19,000.


Of course, if financial aid is available, you could get some help. Nonetheless, you may want to start putting away money for college. A popular college savings vehicle is the 529 plan. Your 529 plan contributions may be deductible from your state taxes, and any earnings growth can be withdrawn tax-free, provided it is used for qualified higher education expenses.

However, if you take withdrawals from your 529 plan, and you don't use the money for these higher education expenses, you may be subject to both income tax and a 10 percent penalty on the earnings.

For your parents—If you have elderly parents, you may want to find out if they've got their retirement and estate plans in place. If they've already taken care of everything, you may not need to get involved. If they've left some loose ends, however, your help could be a valuable gift. So, ask them if they have drawn up the necessary legal documents. Do they each have a will? Have they created a durable power of attorney, which allows them to name someone to make financial and health care decisions on their behalf if they become incapacitated? If it appears they have much work to do in these areas, you may want to offer to arrange a consultation for them with a legal advisor and a financial professional.

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
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## Skyline High School to **HOST SCITECH**

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
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



## Allergies can be responsible for how you feel

By Stuart H. Agren, MD llergies can manifest themselves in a host of different ways.

The most common are the hay fever-variety, but there are plenty of other symptoms with their roots in allergy.

**Asthma**—Asthma is frequently allergy-related. Allergies cause the airways to swell, obstructing normal

breathing. The majority of my asthmatic patients show marked symptom relief with allergy treatment.

**Eczema/Hives—**Most people think these skin problems are a dermatology issue, but they often are caused by allergic inflammation. Eczema sufferers often cycle in vain through multiple dermatologists and prescription creams. However, no amount of topical medication can fix the underlying allergy.

**Chronic sinus and ear infections—**One or two sinus infections a year may be normal, but more may indicate allergy. Allergy causes the lining of the sinuses and ears to swell, so they don't drain properly. When mucus accumulates, bacteria can flourish.

Chronic cough—Allergies lead to mucus production in the nose and throat (post-nasal drip), which irritates the lining of the airways, causing you to cough. Frequent coughs, or coughs lasting beyond seven to 10 days, can indicate allergy.

Conjunctivitis (pink eye)—Repeated or long-lasting conjunctivitis is a strong indicator of allergies. Allergies cause the eye and eyelid to become inflamed. This can lead to itchy or painful eyes, eye crusting or mucus production.

Gastrointestinal problems—Food allergies can contribute to many of the above symptoms and also to irritable bowel syndrome (IBS) symptoms (gas, diarrhea, bloating, cramps).

Fatigue—Allergy symptoms can interrupt sleep patterns, leading to allergic fatigue. Further, allergy

pills, such as antihistamines or decongestants, can derail regular sleep rhythms. It also is possible that the immune system's internal war to fight off allergens can sap your energy.

**Headaches**—Many of my patients with obvious allergy symptoms, such as hay fever, also complain of headaches. This may result from sinus pain and pressure. Some scientists think it also could result from allergic inflammation in the neck muscles or blood vessels in the head.

Additionally, I have found a link between allergy and eosinophilic esophagitis (inflamed esophagus) and interstitial cystitis (chronic inflammatory bladder condition).

In short, when the immune system is depleted by constantly fighting off allergens, your health suffers in a variety of ways.

If you suspect you have allergies, talk to your physician about getting allergy treatment—either through shots or through sublingual (under-the-tongue) allergy drops.

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
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
