

Combine all of the ingredients in a large pot, along with an additional can of water once the orange juice concentrate is emptied from its container. Bring to a simmer. Simmer for about an hour. Strain to remove the cloves, if desired. Serve hot with a slice of pie. ■



Traditional Christmas Stockings Have An Interesting History

is the season so be jolly, and, since it's the holiday season, there will be no real estate talk this month.

We have had such a great response already. I am sure we are going to far exceed the 150 stockings and will be sharing any extras with other charity organizations. A big thank you to everyone for helping to make this possible and making this Christmas a little more special for these children. And on that note, what better topic for this month's article?

THE ORIGIN OF THE CHRISTMAS STOCKING

In many countries around the world, including Germany, Great Britain, Canada and the United States, children hang stockings from the mantelpiece on Christmas Eve to be filled overnight with small gifts from Santa Claus. The precise origins of the tradition of Christmas stockings are not known, but there are a number of clues and theories. The practice of hanging stockings at Christmas, in the United States, dates from the early 19th century at least, and may have its origins in the time of Saint Nicholas, the fourth century Common Era.

Christmas stockings are mentioned in the 1823 poem A Visit From St. Nicholas, which famously begins 'Twas the night before Christmas, so they already were a common

tradition in America by this time.

According to one legend, Christmas stockings honor a charitable gift of the historical Saint Nicholas, a third and fourth century bishop in modern-day Turkey known for his anonymous gifts. The story tells of a poor widower with three daughters who had no chance of marriage, since they could not afford a dowry. Saint Nicholas left gold coins in the girls' stockings as they hung over the chimney at night to dry. Saint Nicholas inherited significant wealth from his parents, and is believed to have made many anonymous gifts to the poor throughout his career as a bishop. He was later transformed by legend into the gift-giving Santa Claus, and Christmas stockings may pay homage to the gift giving of the real Saint Nicholas.

WHY PUT ORANGES IN STOCKING?

Another take on this tale says it was not gold coins Saint Nicholas dropped down the widower's chimney, falling into the girls' stockings. Instead, it actually was gold balls. These gold balls were equally valuable, of course, and still provided a hefty dowry for the daughters. This gives us the reason why today we often put oranges into stockings. The oranges represent the gold balls.

Here is a recipe I make at Christmas and throughout the year. It's such an easy way to bake a variety of vegetables and I love the presentation.

Roasted Root Vegetables with Rosemary:

Nonstick vegetable oil spray

- 1 pound red-skinned potatoes, unpeeled, scrubbed, cut into 1-inch pieces (I usually leave the potatoes out, as I make them on the side)
- 1 pound celery root (celeriac), peeled, cut into 1-inch pieces
- 1 pound rutabagas, peeled, cut into 1-inch pieces
- 1 pound carrots, peeled, cut into 1-inch pieces
- 1 pound parsnips, peeled, cut into 1-inch pieces
- 2 onions, cut into 1-inch pieces

2 leeks (white and pale green parts only), cut into 1-inch-thick rounds

2 tablespoons chopped fresh rosemary

1/2 cup olive oil

10 garlic cloves, peeled

I also add brussel sprouts

Position one rack in bottom third of oven and one rack in center of oven. Preheat to 400 degrees. Spray two heavy large baking sheets with nonstick spray. Combine all ingredients except garlic in very large bowl. Toss to coat. Season generously with salt and pepper. Divide vegetable mixture between prepared sheets. Place one sheet on each oven rack. Roast 30 minutes, stirring occasionally. Reverse positions of baking sheets. Add five garlic cloves to each baking sheet.

Continue to roast until all vegetables are tender and brown in spots, stirring and turning vegetables occasionally, about 45 minutes longer. (Can be prepared four hours ahead. Let stand on baking sheets at room temperature. Reheat in 450 degree oven until heated through, about 15 minutes.)

Bon appétit.







Eliminate the odor coming from your vehicle's vents

iving here in the Valley, your vehicle's AC system gets used almost year round, and over time you may have ♣noticed the air coming from your vents has a foul odor. The main cause of this is the bacteria building up on the evaporator core due to the moisture in the system. The evaporator is located inside of the dash and looks like a radiator, but it has refrigerant passing though it instead of engine coolant.

While you may not realize it, your AC system not only cools the air coming into your vehicle, but it also removes moisture. This is why your AC compressor comes on when you also are using the defroster setting. When the air moves across your evaporator core that is being cooled by the refrigerant, the air cools and the moisture is removed. This is why, when it is very humid, you see the water dripping under your vehicle when the AC is on.

When your system is turned off, the evaporator still is wet from the moisture, and bacteria starts to form. Now, when the air moves across the evaporator, the smell comes with it and into the cabin of your vehicle. Most vehicles are equipped with a cabin air filter. Regular changes of this filter will help lessen the odor but will not eliminate it.





The filter is mainly there to filter out dust and debris, but a charcoal infused filter will help with odor control.

To eliminate the issue, strong disinfecting foam needs to be applied to the evaporator to kill the fungi. The foam is injected into the evaporator housing and it penetrates into the fins of the evaporator. The foam kills the bacteria and will leave it smelling fresh. This should be an annual service, along with changing the cabin filter.

To help your evaporator stay cleaner longer, use your climate control in fresh air mode and not recirculation. Heavy use of recycled air causes a higher level of bacteria to form. You have either a fresh or recycled setting on the climate control unit, or you may have a Max AC setting. Use the fresh air or Non-Max AC option. Turn off the AC unit a few minutes before turning off the car. This will allow the evaporator to dry faster. Keep your cabin filter clean to allow maximum air flow.

As the case is with most maintenance items on your vehicle, the more proactive you are with your preventive maintenance, the fewer issues you will have with that system. ■







Then we hear on television or read in the newspaper the governor has called out the National Guard, we wonder the reason for this action.

Perhaps a levee has broken, or a riot has broken out too intense for the police to control. Yes, these are reasons to rely on the National Guard, but...

On Thursday, Nov. 10, the Social Club of Red Mountain Ranch invited three members of the Arizona National Guard to its annual *Veterans Day Celebration* to speak to the larger work of the guard. The three guardsmen were Colonel Scott Kahldon, with 30 years active and guard service; Lieutenant Colonel Kristofer Bast, 21 years of National Guard duty; and Sergeant Major Graydon Griffin, who has served 22 years with the guard.

Combined, these men served in overseas deployments to Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, South Korea, Central America, Europe, Iraq, Kazakhstan and Afghanistan. Obviously, these locations are far afield from Arizona or any of our other United States.

The purpose of the National Guard is to support—to *make things happen* and meet

standards. The National Guard is comprised of members of our own communities who represent backgrounds of experience, expertise and training, which they then transfer to these support situations.

When working in these foreign countries, our speakers often aided in the reconstruction of lands after years of warfare by rebuilding the infrastructure, as well as roads and bridges. They also established communication services, setting up a 911 line for emergency purposes and helped a country go from a draft-based army to full volunteer military. The guard also built towns from which armies could base.

Another aspect of the National Guard is Defense Support for Civil Authority. This support would entail working in flood areas, after hurricanes or tornadoes, in civil disturbances or when other resources have been exhausted during times of crisis. The Arizona Guard also supports our state agencies in policing our border.

The essence of the National Guard is support. As citizens of Arizona and the nation, we are grateful to them and their families for that support.

This meeting of the social club also honored its own veterans who served in all branches of the military.





HEART DISEASE CAN AFFECT WOMEN

By Dr. Afroze Ahmad **▼**ina Hawkins was working full time and looking forward to an early retirement in four years at the age of 61.

Happily married to Mark, her husband of 37 years, she believed her three grandchildren were a blessing and could not be more grateful for the support

of two loving daughters. In essence, she was living the good life. This all changed one day while walking with her grandchildren at the Phoenix Zoo.

"The squeezing sensation in my right shoulder came suddenly and barely lasted for a few seconds, so I dismissed it as a cramp," Tina said. The squeeze returned while in line waiting for the train. "I had an explanation for it," she said. "My youngest grandchild, Aaron, had just pulled my hand, and I thought that was the reason for the squeeze."

In the next several months, the right shoulder squeezing sensation would return periodically, both at rest and upon exertion. "Surprisingly, each time, I had an explanation for it," Tina admitted. "I would say to myself, 'I slept the wrong way, I carried the heavy grocery bag, or my youngest daughter should buy a better car seat" Tina recalled.

By this time, Tina's husband, Mark, was getting a little concerned with her symptoms. He encouraged her to see her primary care physician. "Initially, I declined, but Mark insisted, and, as such, I had no choice but to set up an appointment with my doctor," Tina admitted. "My doctor did an EKG and reassured me that these are muscle twinges and I am OK."

However, the right shoulder squeeze was recurrent. "By now, it was waking me up at night," Tina said. "One night, the right shoulder squeeze sensation occurred twice and lasted a bit longer. This prompted Mark and me to

report to the emergency room. The emergency room doctor also did an EKG and tested my blood looking for enzymes present when someone is having a heart attack. All tests came out negative and normal. I was, again, sent home reassured."

Little did Tina know these emergency room visits at night would became quite frequent, but would not yield any results except false reassurances. During one of these visits, the emergency room physician actually became angry and frustrated and told Tina heart pain does not occur in the right shoulder, and she should stop worrying

"The persistent nature of the squeezing sensation in my right shoulder and lack of answers or solutions by my doctors prompted me to seek a cardiologist," Tina said. "My cardiologist took a complete history and performed an EKG and stress test. Although, I passed the stress test, my symptoms persisted. My cardiologist did not give up. She recommended some additional tests. I eventually was diagnosed with very tiny and narrow wire-like tubes supplying oxygen to my heart."

Tina's cardiologist explained to her how the oxygen being supplied to her heart by these small tubes is both inadequate and sub-optimal and thereby causing her pain.

"Finally, I had a name and term for my sufferings. I had Microvascular Coronary Artery Disease," Tina said. "My cardiologist explained I would benefit from long-term use of medications and lifestyle changes."

Just like women differ from men in several ways, including thinking, behavior, response to alcohol, etc., women also have different presentations of heart attack. The dramatic sign of clutching the chest is often lacking. Women may have symptoms of anxiety, palpitations, jaw pain, neck pain, shoulder blade pain, arm pain or shoulder pain like Tina. Sometimes, there is no pain but only shortness of breath or unexplained sweating or fatigue.

Also, just because the discomfort or sensation is not in the left chest it does not preclude or eliminate the heart as a cause of symptoms. With that in mind, as a cardiologist, it is recommended patients like Tina avoid ignoring symptoms. Instead, openly discuss concerns with your doctor, who may be able to risk stratify you in terms of your heart. So, keep listening to your heart.



Tips Prove Helpful for Alzheimer's Caregiving During the Holidays

Taring for a loved one with Alzheimer's disease or another form of dementia can be stressful, especially during the holiday season, which is one of the busiest times of the year.

More than half (55 percent) of family caregivers report feeling overwhelmed with caregiving in addition to holiday errands, work and other social responsibilities. To this end, we participated as the featured guest in a discussion on Alzheimer's Caregiving During the Holidays, which was led by the Alzheimer's Association.

Below is an overview of the discussion's highlights, featuring tips on how to navigate the holiday season when caring for a loved one with Alzheimer's in question and answer form.

Q: What are the best ways to involve those living with dementia in holiday preparation?

Try breaking down tasks into simple steps. For example, involve them in gift wrapping by asking them to hand you presents or tape ends. One step won't be as overwhelming as the whole task.

Simple, repetitive tasks can be calming. Involve the person with dementia by having him fold napkins, shell peas or paint do-it-yourself holiday décor.

Play holiday music while you bake, decorate the house or do other holiday preparations with your loved one.

Q: What are some gift ideas to give the caregivers you know?

A gift certificate to a spa is a nice way to encourage the caregiver to take a break and pamper herself. A Marriott gift certificate, for example, can be used for spa services or a nice dinner out.

A useful gift, like paying for groceries to be delivered or a ready-cooked meal, can be both helpful and thoughtful. Safety or assistive devices, which will help care for their loved one, such as door alarms, also can be beneficial.

Offering to help so the caregiver can take a break and go shop or see a movie can mean a lot. If you can't help yourself, hiring respite care for the caregiver is a good way to give a needed break.

Q: How can family caregivers of those living with dementia finish holiday errands or take a break? Respite care is temporary care for a loved one, and it allows the family caregiver a much needed break. She can take this

Additional help, whether from a family member or hired caregiver, can greatly reduce stress. You don't have to feel guilty leaving a loved one alone. Home care services like ours can be contract-free and temporary.

time to run holiday errands or spend time with friends.

Remember, if you are stressed, the person with Alzheimer's can sense this and become anxious, as well. It is good to plan ahead to avoid anxiety.

Q: What should you do when someone with dementia is feeling overwhelmed during the holiday season?

Designate a quiet, safe space away from the business of a holiday gathering. This room shouldn't have a TV or any sound. You may even prepare a sanctuary with activities they enjoy. Adult coloring books can often be calming, too.

Don't push limits. Plan on staying for one hour or two, and inform the host in advance. Too much stimulation can be overwhelming.

Try to prevent overstimulation by ensuring proper seating where the person with Alzheimer's is most comfortable. In addition, remember to accommodate your loved one's specific nutritional needs.

Q: How can people engage their loved one living with dementia in family traditions during the holidays?

The most important thing is to talk to the person before. Some wish to be very involved, while others prefer quiet

Don't talk about them as though they are not there. Engage the person and use nonverbal cues to convey what you mean.

Pass down family traditions to connect the generations. If the person with Alzheimer's wants to, encourage him to share the stories behind the tradition.

The person with Alzheimer's may not remember Christmas, but will remember the joy of the season.



Your presence is enough. So, hold hands and enjoy your time together.

Q: How can families bring children and people living with dementia together successfully?

Offer specific examples to younger children, such as Grandma may not be able to dance much. This will help them know what to expect. Explaining Alzheimer's or dementia may be difficult. So, by offering examples, children can understand more easily.

Share updates with all family members in advance so they are prepared. Send them an email beforehand informing them your loved one has Alzheimer's, what may have changed since the last time they all were together, and what to expect.

Bring children and people living with dementia together by bringing out scrapbooks and hosting a story time. Younger children and toddlers will love this.

Involve younger, tech-savvy kids by asking them to take pictures or record the event. The person with Alzheimer's may enjoy these later.

We hope these useful tips help you and your loved ones enjoy a wonderful holiday season.






