Teach Puppies To Self-Regulate and Play Nicely Together

During the puppy stage, what they learn and experience can affect them for life in either a positive or negative way. YOUR VOICE AND TONE IS IMPORTANT

When giving praise and saying good boy or good girl, include saying the puppy's name first. For example, "Ava, good girl, such a good girl." Be sure your tone of voice is mild and happy.

When several puppies are playing together, limit or avoid using a high-pitched voice because high pitch

> excitement in your voice can escalate puppy play. What you want to do is reward with words and help maintain good play levels. You want to keep their excitement neutralized, so puppies can play longer without their play getting out of control. Your tone of voice should be pleasant and calm. When dogs play, their

> > arousal levels increase

and can escalate quickly,

which is normal. However,

high arousal levels and

over-excited play styles

are closely linked to aggres-

sion. Therefore, you want to

brings his front legs out in front of him and his chest low to the ground as if he remains up.

A play bow is the best visual cue or signal your dog can give to another dog to signal for a desire to play.

This is a welcome sign to the other dog, which says, "I want to play with you. Whatever happens, if it gets too rough, I don't mean it in a bad way. Let's have fun."

Oftentimes, if the other dog accepts the play, he will reciprocate a play bow back, which acknowledges the invitation to engage in play.

Common play styles you will see include running and chasing, body slamming, wrestling, neck biting and rearing up like stallions (my favorite).

After a play bow, everything is good as long as the play between two dogs is balanced play and stays balanced.

BALANCED PLAY HELPS PUPPIES SELF-REGULATE

When dogs play, there should be equal exchange and a balance between the two. Balanced play is the main thing you should be looking for when your dog plays with any other dog. Balance is key for everyone to enjoy the moment. The play should be reciprocated, always.

If one puppy seems to dominate the play, you need to help that puppy learn how to self-regulate, take turns and respect his play friends. Learning self-regulating is best done at an earlier age. Puppies are learning proper dog play etiquette. They learn


> proper play from being around other dogs. You want to ensure your puppy is nice and doesn't acquire those behaviors other dogs consider rude.

So, make sure your puppy is happy around other dogs by helping him learn proper dog etiquette, as well as how to selfregulate. same monthly mortgage payment. While home values would have gone up, your buying power would have gone down. The chart on the left shows the cost of waiting a year.

SELLERS

One of the questions I am often asked by sellers is whether they should sell now or wait and let their home value continue to increase. If you are buying in the same market, it doesn't pay to wait. If you are moving up, while your home price is going to increase, so is the home you are going to purchase, but with a higher base price, it will increase more. If you are downsizing, while you may sell for more, the higher mortgage rate may negate any gain.

INTEREST RATES CAN HAVE BIGGEST IMPACT

After seeing record low interest rates over the past few years, rates have now started to increase and they are expected to continue to go up. This can have the biggest impact on whether to sell and buy now or wait a year. These charts on the right estimate a home price increase of 9 percent, current interest rate of 4 percent, with an increase to 5.5 percent in a year. As you can see, the sales price is slightly impacted, but the biggest difference is your monthly mortgage payment. With interest rates on the rise, now is the best time to make your move.

The longer you wait, whether you are a buyer, seller or both, the more expensive buying a home will be. You will be paying more to purchase the home plus a higher monthly mortgage payment. If you don't qualify for a higher loan, your purchasing power will be reduced. Therefore, while homes are going up in price, the price you can afford to purchase is going down.

Another interesting collectible is the vintage candy mold. These molds were made of metal but were used yearly to produce candy. So, examples in good condition are hard to find. Holland is credited with producing some of the best molds. A recent example, from Tilburg, Holland, was found on Ebay for \$500.

Who knows, maybe this Easter will inspire you to go on your own treasure hunt for bunnies and eggs. In any event, enjoy the holiday and try not to eat too many of those Peeps and chocolate eggs. ■

Increase the Efficiency of Your AIR CONDITIONING SYSTEM

Tere are five important tips associated with L ensuring the most from your air conditioning system this summer.

TIP 1—KEEP YOUR FILTER CLEAN

According to a source on Energy.Gov, a dirty filter could increase energy use by

5 to 15 percent. This doesn't sound like a lot, but when you consider our air conditioning systems run more than 6,800 hours each year, the increased energy cost adds up quickly. Dirty filters restrict airflow, which makes it harder for your system to work, decreases comfort, causes stress on your system and drives up energy costs. Unfortunately, many homeowners forget about keeping the filter clean. Start by checking it monthly, and adjust the timing to fit your needs.

TIP 2—CLEAN COILS

Dirty coils make your system work harder and drive up your electric bill. You should clear away dirt and debris (fallen leaves, grass clippings, etc.), which has collected around the condenser unit. Trim foliage back at least 2 feet to allow enough airflow around the unit. If you use your hose to do the cleaning, do not spray it directly at the condenser coils, as this may drive debris deeper inside. Instead, angle the nozzle, so it sprays perpendicular to the side of the coil.

TIP 3—KEEP CONDENSATE DRAIN LINE CLEAN

Along with cooling your home, your air conditioner lowers humidity. Your system has a drain line to discard moisture removed from the air, and just like any drain in your home, it can become clogged. This creates a place for mold and bacteria to grow and could overflow and cause damage to your system and surrounding areas. The solution is to keep your condensate drain clear. This service is best left to a professionally trained technician and should be part of any maintenance or tune-up service.

TIP 4—DON'T BLOCK VENTS OR REGISTERS

Your system needs proper airflow to prevent pressure problems and to operate efficiently. Avoid blocking vents and registers with furniture. Adjust registers in rooms needing more or less cooling, but don't close more than one or two of them. Although this is a popular belief, closing registers will cause your system to work less efficiently and may lead to damage to your system and higher energy

TIP 5—SCHEDULE ANNUAL MAINTENANCE

The secret to keeping your system working longer is to keep it properly maintained. Think about how important oil changes and tune-up maintenance are for your car. It's the same concept for your system. Improper maintenance is the No. 1 cause of system breakdown and early system failure. Proper maintenance will increase your system's efficiency, your comfort, as well as decrease your energy usage, and, when done consistently, add years to the life of your system. In fact, it is so important, most manufacturers of air conditioning systems require annual maintenance to keep warranties in force.

Create your own personal pension

Tirst came pensions, or defined benefit **◄** plans, with their guaranteed income for life. Then came 401(k)s with their focus on growth from the stock and bond markets. 

Household Modifications Can Help Prevent Falls By Older Americans

Percentage of the National Council on Aging, falls are the leading cause of fatal and nonfatal injuries for people aged 65 and older.

Falls by members of our senior population often result in hip fractures, broken bones and head injuries. If you are caring for an aging loved one, it is important to *fall proof* your home, both inside and outdoors. You can do the following to make your home safer:

- · Remove safety hazards in all rooms.

- 1. Remove anything that could cause your loved one to trip or slip while walking—It is easy to trip on clutter collected on the floor and the stairs. Small furniture may tip over and create a fall hazard. Dog bowls, electrical and phone cords also can create trip hazards. Throw rugs are especially dangerous because they can slip on the floor and can create an uneven floor surface for walking. Remove them from every room of the house.
- 2. Arrange furniture to provide plenty of walking room—A senior's vision may begin to fade and narrow. Therefore, it is important to make sure there is a lot of space between furniture for easy walking.
- **3.** Put non-slip strips on floors and steps—It is important that every walking surface in the home be as non-slip as possible. It will help to place non-slip strips on stairs and a rubber mat on the floor of your bathtub or shower.
- 4. During the winter, spread salt and sand on walkways and the driveway—Make sure your loved one's entry is

cleared of snow and ice. This includes making sure leaking gutters aren't causing ice build-up near doors.

5. Good lighting is essential to preventing falls—Walk around your loved one's home, and take a quick inventory of lighting. When assessing outdoor lighting, make sure it removes as many shadows as possible. Waning eyesight can't decipher easily between shadow and light, which can result in falls. Good lighting on stairways, both indoor and outdoor, is especially important, with light switches at both the top and better of stairs.

Indoor lighting should include night lights in all rooms and hallways. Lamps should be placed within easy reach of the bed and should have the highest wattage bulb allowed by the fixture. Place night lights in the bathroom, hallways, bedroom and kitchen. Place a flashlight by the bed for extra safety.

6. Handrails and guardrails can prevent falls—Make sure handrails are in place on both sides of stairs and walkways. Grab bars should be installed in the tub, shower and next to the toilet.


