Gucci Pooch owner grooms teen to groom dogs

ucci Pooch Pet Salon owner Lisa Montoya has joined with the Mesa Public Schools Transition from School to Work (TSW) program to train special needs teens for future employment while they still are attending high school.

Lisa's first student is a Mountain View High School 12th-grader (*UpClose is omitting her name for privacy considerations*) with speech and hearing impairments. "She comes to the salon three days a week for her fifth and sixth period classes to learn the basics of dog grooming," Lisa related. "Her teacher, Keri Borstelmann, and a signing translator accompany her."

According to the salon owner, dogs are great judges of humans. "The dogs really take to her, and I can tell she has a special knack for caring for them," she stated.

Lisa starts out slowly and explains each step of the procedure, like acclimating the dog to the groomer, teaching techniques for holding and washing the animal, introducing the dog to a blow dryer and grooming tools, while adding a few more steps each time. "After several months of increasingly more difficult tasks, students will be competent to obtain work as dog washers. Eventually, they can move up to grooming the hair with clippers and trimming nails."

A good groomer also learns to look out for physical impairments, such as ear infections or skin lesions, which are more noticeable during the washing procedure.

"Another part of the training is research on the Internet," Lisa explained. "For homework, I have her research things like dog health issues and what hairstyles are particular to each breed. The more and faster one learns, the more opportunities will become open to them," Lisa continued.

There are some very excellent but expensive textbooks

available. If someone would like to donate toward them, it would be most appreciated.

"I wish I had had a program like this to groom me for this job," Lisa admitted. "I started as a washer and worked for a salon for a long time. I learned cutting by watching the other groomers. They never trained me, and even though I knew how to do it, and they let me do the trimming, they didn't pay me extra because I wasn't trained," she continued. "So, I know how it is to be a young person struggling to get a job. I hope this is just the first of many students I can help to learn the profession I love."

Lisa's big break came in 1990, when she answered the salon phone one day. "A woman asked if anyone there wanted to buy a salon with the phone number and 29 years of existing customers for \$3,500," she recalled. "I said, "Definitely," and ran home to ask my dad for a loan. I was in business for myself the next week, and paid him back with my profits a week later. I have been doing this ever since."

The TSW program, sponsored through the Arizona Department of Vocational Rehabilitation, is available through local high schools. "It is targeted to special needs students in grades nine through 12 who are eager to gain competitive employment," Keri explained. "Businesses are not paid for their participation, and it is done on a voluntary basis. We always are looking for more businesses to offer training slots to our students."



Brekyn loves her ability to make events special, by singing requested songs and performing the soundtrack for an event's most important moments—like the first dance of a wedding.


"It's super fun, and being able to sing the first dance songs and all the requested songs is amazing," she said. ■



Launches to Challenge Students

SDA provides students from kindergarten through grade eight with an accelerated curriculum within a nurturing and supportive environment. All students learn a minimum of one grade level ahead of the Arizona Department of Education Mathematics and English Language Arts standards.

Year after year, SDA students have proven they can achieve high levels of academic learning and success. During the 2017-2018 school year, SDA has piloted a unique gifted and talented program, the Young Scholars Program. Young Scholar participants are outstanding students. Teachers have identified them as students who have high personal and academic standards, consistently exhibiting a passion for learning and dedication to success. They often are leaders

in the classroom and school community.

The Young Scholars Program challenges students by engaging them in various project-

based activities. The assignments require research, application of mathematical concepts, critical thinking skills, problem solving skills and in-depth discussions.

For particular projects, some students fulfill the role of project manager, further enhancing their leadership skills. Participation in this program allows students to reach their highest potential. The school community anxiously is awaiting the many discoveries and creations from the program participants.

The Young Scholars Program is spearheaded by two veteran teachers, Mrs. Annmarie Rivera and Mrs. Jamie Smith. Mrs. Rivera has been an employee of SDA since 2006. In addition to her role as an elementary and middle school teacher, Mrs. Rivera has been a member of the site-based management team. This school year marks Mrs. Smith's eighth year as an elementary education teacher with SDA. Both teachers are passionate about education, dedicated to their students, and have an amazing ability to assist students to reach their highest potential.

Culinary teachers spark THE JOY OF COOKING

The scent of freshly baked waffles fills the advanced culinary classroom at Mountain View High School.

Teacher Loren Saulsby grades his students' work one bite at a time. The former restaurateur shares his passion for food while teaching students to be self-sufficient and independent thinkers in the kitchen.

"Students learn life skills in my classroom," Loren said. "Whether they cook for their parents, college roommates or, one day, for their own families, cooking is a practical skill they can take with them everywhere in life."

From julienne, to chiffonade, students receive a solid understanding of food, as well as different cooking and baking methods. Students learn the importance of keeping a clean kitchen, mastering chopping skills, identifying meat cuts and various cooking methods.

Five years ago, the program consisted of three classes. Today, more than 350 students in eight classes enjoy learning to bake breads, stir fry delicacies and make pasta. Students put their skills on display for the



community in a variety of ways. Culinary students help feed the 200-member Toro marching band on traveling football game days. This tall order includes 400 pancakes, 50 pounds of bacon and 500 cookies. Students give back to the community during Thanksgiving by baking and donating 130 pies to St. Vincent de Paul.

SHARING PEARLS OF WISDOM AT RED MOUNTAIN HIGH

Chef Jen Pearl, culinary arts teacher at Red Mountain High School, spent more than 16 years in the industry. Her resume includes executive chef and general manager positions, and for the past two years, she has inspired students at Dobson and Red Mountain high schools to enjoy the art of cooking. Students learn skills like budgeting and shopping for groceries and meal planning. All the while, they are developing a new respect for people who put food on restaurant tables.

"I have always wanted to teach culinary arts," Jen said. "Cooking is like life. It isn't perfect, and sometimes, you have to improvise for your dish to turn out. I want my students to know that lessons can be learned and mistakes can be fixed."

Students are eager to engage and innovate. They are hands on and take their dishes to the next level. Later this month, culinary students will put their catering skills to the test by providing hors d'oeuvres and cupcake selections for a wedding. ■





TOP SIX QUESTIONS ASKED BY BUYERS AND SELLERS

or nine years now, I have ◀ had the pleasure of being a full-time Realtor, and I have found buyers and sellers often ask the same questions.

No matter what the market conditions are, the questions have stayed the same. Here are the six questions most often asked.



QUESTIONS FROM SELLERS

Q. How do I sell my house for the highest price?

A. This is the No. 1 question I am asked by sellers. Having a top local Realtor who uses professional photography and innovative marketing is a must. Next, you want to make an excellent first impression by getting the house ready for sale. Discuss with your Realtor what upgrades can be done that you can capture back in the price. Painting, cleaning, decluttering and sprucing up the yard may not necessarily increase your home's value, but it will make your home look clean and inviting and appealing to buyers. Staging the home is so important and can make all the difference on how quickly you sell. Homes sold within the first 30 days are more likely to sell for list price or closer to the list price than those that sit on the market.

Q. Should I do repairs before listing my home?

A. I always suggest sellers repair those inexpensive items they easily can do themselves or have a handyman take care of before they list. Things like broken light fixtures, dripping faucets or broken faceplates make the home seem like maintenance was neglected. Doing little things before you list will leave buyers with the impression the house is well maintained. That being said, you don't want to do extensive repairs. The buyer will have an inspection and will ask the seller to make certain repairs. Each buyer is different, and what one buyer would ask for, another might not. So, it's better to wait and see what items the buyer

requests. The seller is not obligated to make any repairs. This is a negotiation, and the purchase price and terms of the contract can determine how many repairs you are

Q. Will the buyers always have an agent with them when they are in my home?

A. Yes, the buyer's agent will show your home with their buyers. The agent's information will be registered when she uses the lock box to enter your home. Your Realtor will be notified, through the lock box, as to who entered and when, as well as how long they were in the home. Buyers will be walking through your home, however, so make sure you lock away any valuables.

QUESTIONS FROM BUYERS

Q. With all the access to homes on the Internet, do I need a buyer's agent?

A. The short answer to this question is yes. Some online sources have partial or outdated information, and sites, such as Zillow, value homes using their Zestimate, which is more often than not tens of thousands of dollars off the true market value.

Having your own Realtor means having someone who is taking care of your best interests and whose fiduciary responsibility is to you. Your Realtor will have the knowledge and expertise to help you navigate through the purchase contract, oversee inspections and negotiate on your behalf. There is so much more to buying a house than just putting in an offer. Your Realtor will be there to ensure everything goes as smoothly as possible. Best of all, it doesn't cost you anything. There is no fee to the buyer to have his own agent.

Q. Do I have to be pre-qualified?

A. You should get pre-qualified before going out looking at houses for several reasons. Until you talk to a lender, you don't know how much you can qualify for. It may be more or less than you think. The last thing you want to do is to go looking at homes and fall in love with your dream home only to find out you can't afford it. Another reason

is because you need to include the pre-qualification when submitting your offer to show the seller you are financially able to purchase the home. We are in a seller's market and if you find the perfect home, you need to be ready to put in an offer immediately. If you have to wait to get prequalified, you may lose the home to another buyer. There are a lot of fees associated with purchasing a home. Talking to your lender upfront will also give you the information on how much it actually will cost you to purchase a home and all the fees involved.

Q. I have a home to sell. Can I still write an offer on another home?

A. If you can qualify for both mortgages at the same time without selling your current home and choose to do so, then, yes, you can write an offer without it being contingent on you selling your current home. However, most buyers need to sell their current home before they can purchase a new one. When you write an offer, it will be contingent on the sale of your home. So, if, for some reason, your home doesn't close, you are not obligated to the purchase of the new one. In order to write an offer with a contingency, your home needs to be under contract. Some sellers may accept an offer without your home

being under contract, but usually not.

Annual Physicals Address ILLNESS PREVENTION

ife gets busy with work, kids, school, activities and family—I understand completely—but all too often, our health gets put on the back burner and a true physical, targeted at prevention, gets squeezed out.

In family medicine, we are perfectly trained to address

The relative affordability of this holiday's memorabilia makes this field of collecting fun and easily accessible. There are a number of price guides now available to help with valuations, and you can find many items online through vintage resale sites or on auction websites.

Tes, October is officially fall car care month, but realistically, every month is car care month. Your car is the second most expensive investment you will make and it is the most expensive to maintain. However, if you are willing to spend a little extra on your maintenance when your car is newer, it will help to keep your repair bills much lower as your car gets older.

We may have put men on the moon and figured out how to split atoms, but I'm sorry, we have not developed any fluid for your vehicle that does not break down with age and contamination, no matter what the manufacturers are saying. As a matter of fact, if you read their fine print, they admit it with footnotes, like driving in dusty conditions, extensive idling, towing or hot temperatures will require more frequent servicing.

The bottom line is maintaining your vehicle properly will always benefit you. Repairing your vehicle comes on your dime not theirs. At least half of the repairs we do on cars could have been prevented with a good maintenance schedule.

For example, power steering fluid not only provides the hydraulic pressure from which the system operates, but it also lubricates the system. Over time, the fluid no longer provides adequate protection and the result is component failure or system leakage. Both are direct results of poor fluid maintenance.

Engine coolant becomes acidic over time, and this causes the system to deteriorate from the inside out. The problem here is that the coolant will look fine and you will not know there is an issue until it is too late. Another issue with some coolants is they start to solidify when exposed to air and can cause blockages in the system.

Brake fluid is hydroscopic, which means it can retain moisture over time. This causes two

1. The fluid will have a lower boiling point, and the fluid will not operate the system

2. The moisture will gather at a low point of the system and corrode that component, usually a caliper, master cylinder or wheel cylinder, and cause it to fail.

All driveline fluids, such as transmission, differential and transfer cases lubricate, transfer heat and suspend contaminants. The No. 1 nemesis of these fluids is heat. For every 20 degrees over normal operating temperature these systems run, it cuts protective mileage in half. So, 100,000-mile fluid, with a normal operating temp of 175 F, is only good for 50,000 at 195 F and 25,000 at 225 F.

EMOTIONALLY FOCUSED THERAPYIs a Valuable Resource for Couples

If you haven't heard of Emotionally Focused Therapy (EFT), the idea of couples therapy may be limited to images of having the same fight with your partner in front of a stranger who is judging you, taking sides, or telling you where you've gone wrong.

If you haven't experienced it firsthand, you may only see couples therapy the way it is portrayed in the media. While those portrayals may make people laugh (or cry), it is no wonder so many who could benefit from couples therapy are reluctant to give it a try.

The good news is EFT is nothing like that. First of all, EFT has a 75 percent success rate, with 93 percent of couples reporting a significant improvement. Also, in two-year follow-up studies, couples report their relationship continued to improve even after they ended therapy. This result is unprecedented with any other model of therapy, considering clients usually decline after completing therapy.

Even if you have the best therapist using older techniques, and you learn some great *communication skills*, those skills usually go out the window when emotions get heated. It is not a couple's skills that determine the quality of a relationship. It's the way they view and experience each other that matters most.

The bottom line is no skills will work as long as partners maintain a stance of defensiveness, feeling they must fight against the other or protect themselves from each other. Additionally, criticism, contempt and stone-walling are the cancers of relationships. When partners view each other as being on the same team, and trust that they both have the other's best interest at heart, they can fight together, instead of against each other.

EFT helps partners shift from seeing each other as the enemy, into experiencing each other as an ally. By helping couples view themselves and each other differently, they are more able to create the relationship they desire, connect

more deeply, and organically respond to one another with compassion and genuine support.

The truth is partners really only fight about one thing: "Do I matter to you enough that you will be there for me when I need you most?" When partners receive the reassurance they need that they have each other's back through thick and thin, previous disconnects can be healed. EFT is a valuable resource for helping couples experience this type of reconnection and restoration of trust.

EFT THERAPISTS WHO ACCEPT INSURANCE

If you ever have tried to find a therapist who has been trained in EFT, you know it is nearly impossible to find one who accepts your insurance. There are only a handful of therapists in Arizona who are certified in EFT, and none of them accept insurance. The Arizona Relationship Institute was created by Dr. Lisa Gold with the goals of: 1) providing exceptional EFT training and supervision

to therapists, so that they could 2) provide high-quality EFT therapy to clients, and that 3) those services would be covered by Blue Cross Blue Shield insurance.

All AZRI therapists receive weekly training and supervision to effectively practice EFT. They also are trained to effectively use EFT to treat all dimensions of couples' relationships. Specializations include healing infidelity and other betrayals, sexual difficulties (desire discrepancy and trauma, etc.), interfaith couples, and dealing with life transitions (parenthood, re-location and retirement, etc.).





I am so sorry to hear that you are going through this. It is possible that you can move through this, and perhaps even have a better relationship than the two of you ever had. However, you need to go through the proper steps to have a chance at mending (and possibly reinventing) the marriage.

First and foremost, I recommend you start couples therapy with a therapist specializing in couples and infidelity. That way, you will have professional guidance to walk you through the healing process. Your initial role is to figure out what it is you need in order to begin rebuilding the trust. Perhaps you need to have access to his phone (texts

and voicemails, etc.) and computer. You may need to have him check in with you so you know where he is and with whom. Maybe you need to know

Obesity Can Be a Serious Problem For Pets

ot just a problem for people, our pets are experiencing obesity, too, and packing on the pounds.

The 2012 annual National Pet Obesity Awareness Day Survey conducted by the Association for Pet Obesity Prevention (APOP) found that 52.5 percent of dogs and 58.3 percent of cats are said to be overweight or obese by their veterinarians. That's an astonishing 80 million dogs and cats in the U.S. at risk of developing any number of weight-related disorders.

The major cause of this epidemic is overfeeding. Overfeeding our pets can lead to a number of significant health concerns. Not only can obesity shorten the lives of our pets, the health risks can include diabetes or insulin resistance, joint problems, osteoarthritis, respiratory disorders, high blood pressure and heart disease, kidney and liver problems and many forms of cancer.

It is important to periodically check your pet's weight throughout all life stages. Putting your pet on the scale is not the best way to evaluate his weight, as there is a great variance in a breed's weight and size. Rather, it's better to look at the appearance of the pet. This means:

- You should be able to feel the ribs easily without pressing, but you should not be able to see the ribs through the coat.
- The torso also should resemble an hourglass when viewed from above. You can conduct these quick checks on your own, but since it can be hard for


If you are faced with on overweight pet, first rule out medical reasons for being overweight.

Just like us, there is a recommended calorie intake for our pets. A small pet may only need about 300 calories a day. If we add in a couple of those tasty treats at 50 calories each, that is one third of the daily allowance. Not reducing the portion of kibble to offset the treats they receive could lead to overfeeding and weight gain.

It is important for pet guardians to understand the risks to their pet's health if he is carrying just a few extra pounds. For

example, if your little Yorkshire terrier weighs 12 pounds, and he should weigh seven, that's like a 5-foot 4-inch woman weighing 223 pounds. ■

magine a potter at the wheel shaping a clay pot by hand.

As he works the clay, a defect causes the pot to wobble out of shape. So, the potter pushes the clay back into a ball and begins to re-form the clay into the pot he had in mind all along.

It's actually an image of God shaping our lives, as well. The Bible calls God the potter and we are the clay in his hands. He is shaping our lives, utilizing the tools of time, experiences, heartaches and celebrations. He shapes us through the people He surrounds us with, and through the life we share together in His church. God shapes our lives so we can be simple, earthly vessels who carry the eternal treasure of Christ and His good news of new life.

But, sometimes we all become cracked pots. I'm betting you're thinking, "Yeah, I've known a few crack pots for sure." And I have, too. But I want you to take this the right way—those folks have known you and me, too. Sometimes, our clay pots have been cracked by sin, distraction from God's plans and His design for our lives.

In those moments, God has sought to re-form us. This He does through Christ our Savior who died to pay the price for our sins. He rose up from the grave to overcome even death itself, and through Christ alone, we have new life here in time and eternal life to come in His heavenly home.

On Oct. 31, 1517, a monk named Martin Luther nailed a list of 95 key discussion points to the castle church door in Wittenberg, Germany, wanting to start a discussion. He actually kicked off the Reformation era of the Christian church. God's re-formed us in Christ and through the Reformation era. He re-formed, or re-focused, us again on God's Word and the new life He gives us. ■

Home Sales And Prices Are Up in the Valley

By John Karadsheh n the last 45 days, we listed six homes under \$325,000 (Mesa, Gilbert and Glendale), with each of them selling in less than a week and almost all for full price.

In each case, we were able to get our clients top dollar for their properties. What is happening in the Valley? Are

we in a bubble? According to Tom Ruff, of the Arizona Regional Multiple Listing Service, home sales are up 9 percent from last year, and Phoenix's median home price is up 6.5 percent for the year. The improving local economy, firsttime homebuyers, and relocations are driving the boost.

Many first-time homebuyers have waited years to be in the position to buy and finally are ready. Boomerang buyers who finally have recovered from short sales and foreclosures also are jumping in again. Furthermore, for two consecutive years, Maricopa County has been the fastest growing county in the country.

So, what is up with inventory? It's low. In the hot market of 2005, there were approximately 9,000 singlefamily homes on the market. In 2009 and 2010, we had more than 75,000 single-family homes on the market. A balanced market, which we had last year, is considered to be around 22,000 to 24,000 homes.

Right now, we have less than 15,000 homes on the market in our entire MLS database, which includes all of Arizona, from Kingman to Bisbee. Now, you can understand why investors from all over the country are building apartments in the Valley, and builders are clamoring to get new projects in the ground.

The market intensity is still mostly below \$400,000 and it is stronger in certain areas. In some pockets of the Valley, we are seeing homes that actually have caught up to their 2005 values, which is amazing to see after all we have been through. Over \$400,000, the market is not as intense, but it certainly is catching up. On the plus side, this type of market structure can offer unique opportunities for those clients wanting to move up to a higher price range.

So, do we have a real estate bubble? No. In the case of our current market, investors aren't the ones scooping up properties as much as regular individuals who are purchasing primary residences. Furthermore, buyers actually have to qualify to get a loan. Under the new Dodd-Frank lending regulations, the loan approval process is much more comprehensive than it was in 2005.


The market intensity is mostly the result of backlog. For years, new construction was non-existent in the Valley, financing was tight, first-time buyers didn't have the resources to enter the market, and others simply were hamstrung by the consequences of the recession. We finally are just catching up to where we should have been.

The Valley is outpacing the nation in job creation, with an increasing number of corporate relocations and expansions, which means our growth is set to continue for some time. Unless we see a sudden increase in real estate inventory, our prices will continue to rise. ■


