




AROUND MESA

A Building Permit Is Needed For New Projects Or Remodeling

ne of the most common questions District 5 residents ask in Mesa is how to go about obtaining a permit to build something.

The process actually is simple. This includes the permit, to have

that pool, shed or whatever you may want to build, approved by the City of Mesa.

WHEN DO YOU NEED A PERMIT?

A building permit is required when any structural change or major alteration is made to a building, or when any new construction is undertaken. Permits for building, mechanical, plumbing and electrical work are required. The goal of the permitting process is to make sure all buildings are safe and free from hazards. Mesa provides assistance to homeowners for many *Do-It-Yourself* projects.

The first step is to visit the City of Mesa website and visit the Digital Innovation for Mesa's Electronic Services, or DIMES, section. You will need to set up an account with the city to request a permit. Once you have set up an account, log in and select *Apply for a permit*. You must also submit electronic plans when you submit your application, along with a permitting fee. Fees vary depending on the type of work.

WHY DO YOU NEED A PERMIT?

A permit ensures that construction complies with the City of Mesa building codes and zoning regulations. It is better to discover code discrepancies during



the plan preparation process rather than after your project is under construction. The inspector may discover faulty materials, deviations from the approved plans or violations of codes and regulations, which may result in an unsafe or hazardous condition for you and your family.

Once your application and plans have been submitted, the review process will last approximately 10 days. Once a permit has been obtained, there are certain responsibilities placed on the homeowner/contractor. The individual doing the work authorized by the permit must call for an inspection prior to covering or concealing the work. The required inspections must be scheduled and passed before work can continue or be concealed. Permits are valid for 180 days after the permit is issued.

PRESCHOOL GIFTED PROGRAM Provides Unique Opportunity

hen visiting preschools, parents watch little children play dress up in their classrooms or build with blocks.

The children joyfully dress up as firefighters or put on police helmets. They build complex structures with blocks and pretend they are building cities. Children learn through play.

However, research indicates simply dressing up may not be enough for an enriched preschool that focuses on developing the potential of all children, especially the gifted children. When the preschool curriculum combines creative play with an exposure to rich language and vocabulary, math concepts, as well as music and art, these young children demonstrate increased critical thinking skills and enhanced cognitive gains.

An enriched early childhood curriculum prevents potential underachievement among gifted children. It maximizes the development of their potential.

When it comes to the design of a gifted program, a flexible model that allows for differences in a child's learning style is crucial. Different programs have different strengths and weaknesses. Fortunately, none of these are mutually exclusive. The only requirements are valuing high expectations, emphasizing academic excellence and setting challenging standards must guide the gifted program (Buchanan et al., 2008).

All children have differing abilities, but this does not mean that children with excellent abilities need less. In fact, gifted children are often more disadvantaged. Only a small fraction of preschools and charter schools provide gifted programs.

It is important that the program focuses on exploration in an interactive and responsive environment. The students need to be encouraged to learn through experimental inquiry and the use of manipulatives. It also is important to provide the students with the opportunity to become independent problem solvers in a nurturing, supportive environment. By using a thematic approach, Self Development Preschool addresses the needs of the individual child. The enriched curriculum exposes children to higher-level thinking and relies not on the use of pencil and paper activities, but instead, focuses on exploration.

The curriculum at Self Development Preschool is an academically focused program. It is the delivery of this academic program that sets Self Development Preschool apart from the rest. The way in which the knowledge is shared with the students is through an age-appropriate medium that encourages critical thinking, social skills, independence and well-rounded children.

Dr. Anjum Majeed, founder of Self Development Preschool and superintendent of Self Development Academy, designed the program with the growth and self-development of the children as the primary goal. This has been accomplished by focusing on more than pencil and paper academic exercises. The focus is creating lifelong learners who reach their full potential.



• Children, non-swimmers and inexperienced swimmers should wear life vests.

• Glass containers are not allowed in the Lower Salt River Recreational Area. Ice chests/coolers will be checked for glass containers. Please bring plastic or can beverage containers.

Have a great time while visiting the Lower Salt River. Responsibly appoint a designated driver *before* your tubing adventure. Drugs, alcohol and the Salt River do not mix. Just don't do it.

Salt River Tubing operates under permit of the United States Department of Agriculture Forest Service and is located in Tonto National Forest.

Salt River Tubing is located in Northeast Mesa, just seven minutes from Highway 202 East and Power Road, Exit 23A.

Daily operating hours at Salt River Tubing are 9 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. ■

e were excited to have a chance to sit down with District 5 Councilmember David Luna, who is running for re-election to the Mesa City Council.

He is looking for your support and vote, either by early ballot or by the primary election, which will be held on Aug. 28.

As a District 5 councilmember, David Luna has been a proponent for strong public schools, important public safety initiatives and the building of vibrant neighborhoods. David is familiar with the education arena, from more than 30 years working in Mesa Public Schools, as well as teaching as an adjunct professor for Arizona State University (ASU) and Mesa Community College (MCC).

As a councilmember, David works with partners such as the Mesa and Arizona chambers of commerce, the Greater Phoenix Economic Council, the Arizona Commerce Authority, and most importantly, his District 5 residents.

neighbors—but also the families who have established their homes with us for decades.

I also believe in increased business opportunities through the strategic plan initiated by the Falcon Field Economic Commission. I want to ensure that the Falcon District remains an innovative, high-tech hub for aviation/aerospace and defense, advanced manufacturing and business services.



Q: Are there other campaign missions where you believe you can make a difference?

Everyone knows my history in education with Mesa Public Schools, ASU and MCC, so they know I am passionate about learning at all levels. However, I also believe that the Mesa K-Ready initiative should be a true focus because it prepares preschool-age children for their future education opportunities in our community. Mesa K-Ready strengthens our children before they enter kindergarten to help them be ready to learn and have the opportunity to excel academically.

I also will continue to make sure District 5 is considered in all City Council discussions related to streets, parks, bonds,

public safety and residential development. I take my role as a speaker for the entire community seriously and with great respect.

Q: Is there anything else you would say to your constituents before the election in August?

I am here for you—in person, by phone or by email. I maintain mobile office hours at the Red Mountain Public Library and listening sessions specifically for constituent services at my Luna Landing community gatherings. In addition, you can always reach me by phone at (480) 935-8765.

I am here for the District 5 community today, and I hope to be here in January 2019 for another four years of work toward a stronger, more vibrant Mesa. ■

Vintage slot machines are especially collectible, as many are still functional and can be played (for amusement purposes only), and they are reminders of old Las Vegas, when parking and shrimp cocktails were free, and you just may have seen one of the Rat Pack roaming the casino floor.

The first slot machines originated in the late 1800s with the Liberty Bell three-reel machine, invented by Charles

Fey, of San Francisco, considered the first *modern-style* slot machine. This machine was capable of making an automatic payout when matching combinations of symbols came up on the reels, something the first machines weren't capable of doing.

Some of the more readily available vintage slot machines are those produced by Bally, Mills Novelty, Jennings, Watling, Rock-Ola and Pace. Fully restored machines from the 1920s through 1940s might fetch a few thousand dollars. In some cases, up to \$24,000 for rare machines. Unrestored examples could bring a thousand dollars or so. One of my favorites is the Poinsettia slot machine pictured here. It was produced from 1928 to about 1930 by the Mills Novelty Company.

Red Mountain High School graduate cultivates A LESSON IN ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP

estled on a corner of the Red Mountain High School campus is the KinderU playground, where preschoolers enjoy playing on the grass turf, which is all thanks to forwardthinking 2018 graduate Lexy McConaghie.

At the beginning of the school year, students in Shane Bycott's Advanced Placement environmental science class were challenged to *Change the World* through a service project. Lexy chose to put her talents toward improving the young learners' playground.

"Lexy took this project to heart," Shane shared. "It wasn't just green sod versus brown grass. She modified the overall structure of the area, making a big impact on our campus."

Sharon Pratt, who directs Red Mountain High School's KinderU program, was thrilled to have Lexy's help in improving her students' experiences. "The revival of the grass adds a natural play surface that makes our outdoor experiences much better," she said.

To get started on the project, Lexy constructed a plan that put her organizational skills into high gear.

"I thought this project would take me a month," she said with a laugh. "I learned a big project is a lot more work than you think. It takes many people and good management skills."

Lexy reached out to Silverado Enterprises Inc. to ask for a soil donation for the project. Then, she called on friends and members of the National Honor Society to prepare the area.



"It took two days to distribute the dirt," Lexy said. "Once the truck dumped the soil, we took it by wheelbarrow to the playground, and used shovels to level the field."

The Mesa Public Schools operations ground crew assessed drainage issues and installed the sod, which was donated by West Coast Turf. The grounds team modified and replaced sprinkler heads to create better drainage and give the grass an optimal environment to thrive.

Lexy admits there were a few snags along the way, such as when the sod installation had to be rescheduled twice due to the school closures from the #RedforEd walkout.

"The heat exposure and sod's short shelf life required immediate installation," she shared. "But it all came together in the end."

This fall, Lexy will attend Brigham Young University in Provo, Utah, to major in entrepreneurial management. However, her presence will be felt for years to come at Red Mountain High School, especially among the excited KinderU students. One preschooler summed it up when she said, "I just love the smell of grass." ■

These helpful tips can keep your vehicle cool this summer

Submitted by H and I Automotive ur Arizona summers are pretty toasty, to say the least, so here are some tips to help you and your vehicle cope with our hot weather.

How to cool off the interior of your vehicle quickly:

- Open your windows to let the hot air out. A closed car can reach temperatures above 160 degrees. So, let that very hot air out after starting your car by opening the windows for at least a minute.
- Start off your climate control using fresh air not recycled. Again, because the cabin air will be much hotter than the outside temperature. This will help the conditioned air cool down faster. After a couple minutes, you can switch over to recycled air to continue cooling off the cabin.
- Keep fan speed at mid-range not on high. Lower air volume will allow the air to get colder faster.
- When possible, park with the dashboard facing away from the sun. A hot dash is your biggest nemesis to having cool air because the dash heats it up as it passes through it. If you have to park

toward the sun, use a windshield shade. As a bonus, you also will be able to hold the steering wheel without oven mitts.

• Tint your windows even if you have dark glass. The film not only shades the cabin, but it also has UV protection that will deflect the heat from your vehicle (not to mention it looks pretty snazzy).

If your AC doesn't feel quite right or has a funny smell, you should have the system inspected and diagnosed by a certified technician.

Now is also a great time to replace your wiper blades. Our hot dry weather has basically baked the rubber onto the windshield, so when you do want to use them they either rip or streak the glass as they wipe. Our monsoons show up without notice, so be prepared with a fresh set of blades.

Do These Checks Before Calling for Service if your AC isn't Working

your AC system can be solved quickly and easily.

So, before you reach for the phone to call for service,

use the following checklist to see if you can solve it on your own:

Check Filter—A clogged filter will reduce the amount of cool air entering your home. Plus, it will make your system work harder and could lead to early system failure.

Check Thermostat—It should be set three to five degrees below the room temperature to start your system. Don't be tempted to turn it down further to try to get your system to start. This can cause additional problems.

Check Circuit Breakers— Determine whether any of them are tripped in the electrical panel. Reset if needed.

Check Vents—Make sure all vents and return air ducts are open and not blocked.

Check Air from Indoor

Vents—The air blowing should be cool. If there is no air or it is warm, turn off your unit and call for service. Continuing to run your air conditioner could cause damage to the system.

Check Air from Outdoor

Unit—You should feel warm air blowing out of the top of the unit. If there is no



air or the air is cool, shut off the unit and call for service. Continuing to run your air conditioner could cause damage to your system.

Check the Outdoor Unit—Clear away any debris or landscaping to allow at least 15 inches of free space for proper air flow.

If you see the following symptoms, call right away to avoid damage to your system:

- Fluid or water leaking from the unit.
- Water coming from the upper drain line (typically located on the side of your house, about 10 feet up).
- You see a buildup of ice on the unit.
- + Your system is making strange noises or is noisier than usual.
- You system has a hard time starting up, or you notice your lights dim when it starts.
- Your system runs continually.

Low Back Pain Has Various Risk Factors and Treatment Guidelines

By Dr. Russell Homewood t is estimated eight of 10 adults have low back pain at some time in their lives. For many individuals, episodes of back pain are selflimited. Patients who continue to have back pain beyond the acute period (four weeks) have subacute back pain (lasting between four and 12 weeks)



and may go on to develop chronic back pain (persists for more than 12 weeks). It is rare for back pain to be an indication of something more serious.

Mistakenly, most sudden onset of back pain is labeled a back sprain or strain. A sprain or strain occurs when muscles and ligaments are stretched too far, and tears damage the tissue. The back typically does not go through enough range of motion to result in sprains or strains.

It is much more common to have a degenerative process, such as degenerative disc disease or arthritis of the spine that becomes inflamed by lifting or overworking the area. It is important to understand this is a chronic condition, causing reoccurring pain. Patients need to be educated about rehabilitative exercises and other ways to avoid and treat reoccurrences.

Some risk factors associated with an increased incidence of back pain include smoking, obesity, age, female gender, physically strenuous work, sedentary work, psychologically strenuous work, low educational attainment, Workers' Compensation insurance, job dissatisfaction, and psychologic factors, such as anxiety and depression. Overdoing it at the gym or golf course is one of the most common causes of overextended muscles leading to low back pain. You're especially vulnerable if you tend to be inactive during the workweek and then spend an hour at the gym or softball field on the weekend.

Symptoms requiring urgent care include loss of bowel or bladder control, numbness in the groin area, leg weakness, fever and pain when coughing or urinating. If you have any of these symptoms along with your back pain, contact your doctor.

Also contact your doctor right away if you have back pain and you have a history of cancer, unintentional weight loss, long-term steroid use, weak immune system, history of IV drug use, or your pain gets worse with rest.

Unless low back pain is caused by a serious medical condition, a rapid recovery is expected, even if there is a bulging or herniated disc. The body breaks down bulging discs, taking pressure off the nerve.

BASIC GUIDELINES FOR TREATMENT

Many people are afraid they will hurt their back further or delay recovery by remaining active. However, remaining active is one of the best things you can do. In fact, prolonged bed rest is not recommended. Although highimpact activities should be avoided, it is fine to continue regular day-to-day activities. Using heat can help during the first few weeks. Over-the-counter medicine, such as aspirin, ibuprofen (Advil, Motrin) and naproxen (Aleve), may work better than acetaminophen (Tylenol) for low back pain. They can be taken together, but you should consult your doctor first. A program of exercises can help to increase back flexibility and strengthen the muscles supporting the back. Although starting back exercises or stretching immediately after a new episode of low back pain might temporarily increase the pain, the exercise may reduce the total duration of pain and prevent recurrent episodes.

Recommended activities include those that involve strengthening and stretching, such as walking, swimming, use of a stationary bicycle and low-impact aerobics. Avoid activities that involve twisting or bending, are high-impact, or make the back hurt more. Some specific exercises may help strengthen the muscles of the lower back. People with frequent episodes of low back pain should continue these exercises indefinitely to prevent new episodes.


