MESA COMMUNITY COLLE **Celebrates Student Success**

mong the nearly 2,500 students graduating from Mesa Community College (MCC) this year are many who have not only earned degrees and certificates and have fulfilled higher education goals, but also have received notable accolades, national recognitions and significant scholarships.

Retired 22-year Army veteran Ron Colwell overcame many obstacles to graduating from MCC in May and being accepted into Arizona State University's (ASU) Mary Lou Fulton Teachers College.

"Going to school in your 40s, with PTSD, traumatic brain injury and other physical limitations, takes twice as much effort as a normal person," Ron said.

He recommends to veterans the quiet, low-key environment of the MCC Red Mountain campus, where he studied. Ron said he especially appreciated the support from Student Services Coordinator Bev Maxton, from the Disability Resources and Services Department on campus, as well as Psychology Professor Gayla Preisser, PhD, each who encouraged his research.

Service and leadership always have been core values to honor student Kylee Gillespie, volunteering more than 250 service hours while at MCC. "Erica Horihan, the student life and leadership coordinator at the Red Mountain campus, encouraged me to become more involved in student government and organizations," Kylee said.

Her honors include a National Communication Association Sigma Chi Eta Advisory Board award and receiving educational funds as an All-MCC scholar, a D and B Milner Journalism Foundation scholar and a Mesa Tribune Journalism School scholar.

This fall, Kylee is pursuing a bachelor's degree at the

ASU Walter Cronkite School of Journalism and Mass Communication. She also has been accepted into the ASU Next Generation Service Corps, which pays for her

Zachary Zapata was named a national 2019 Coca-Cola Academic Team Scholar in addition to being selected an All-Arizona First Academic Team scholar, representing the MCC Red Mountain campus. The Coca-Cola funds are going to his ASU classes this fall, where, inspired by losing his father early in life to an illness, he is pursuing a degree in preventative health care, focusing on dentistry.

Graduating in May from the Arizona Agribusiness and Equine Center (AAEC) Red Mountain High School, Dustin Smith heads to study in the Earth Systems Program of the Environmental Science Department at Stanford. She begins fall classes with associate degrees in general studies, arts and science, as well as an academic certificate in sustainability, which she earned at the MCC Red Mountain campus, adjacent to the AAEC school.

"Classes on the college campus helped motivate me to take on more responsibilities and feel confident," Dustin said. "It also opened up college-level resources, including faculty whose support and academic knowledge I credit with helping me compete at the National Science Fair."

TUBING TIPS

Shooting the Salt River rapids is great fun, and company officials recommend the following helpful tubing tips to assist tubers in planning their floating beach blasts for the holiday weekend:

A valid driver's license is required for a tube rental

deposit per five tubes rented.

- Children must be at least 8 years or older and 4 feet tall for tubing and shuttle bus service.
- Life vests are strongly recommended for children, non-swimmers and inexperienced swimmers.
- Glass containers by law are not allowed in the Salt River Recreational Area. Ice chests will be inspected for glass containers before boarding shuttle buses. Please use plastic bottles or aluminum can containers.
- Have a great time during your floating beach blasts, but remember that drugs, alcohol and the Salt River do not mix. Responsibly appoint a designated driver before your tubing adventure.
- Floating picnic ideas include fresh fruit, burritos, fried chicken or sandwiches. Pack picnic items in Ziploc bags to keep dry. Please stash and bag all picnic supplies in litter bags while floating.
- Ice chest/coolers: Fill with ice, sport drinks, fruit juice and water. One to two bottles of water per hour while floating are recommended to help prevent dehydration.

Te still are in a seller's market, and with Maricopa County being the fastest growing county in the U.S. for the third year running, home sales are not expected to slow down any time soon.



More people moved to Maricopa County than any other county in the nation last year, according to U.S. Census Bureau population estimates released in April 2019.

Sellers always have thought of the summer months to be the slowest time to sell homes in Arizona, and many will take their homes off the market in June, July and August. In addition, new sellers will wait until the fall before listing their homes. While it's true that the market

compared to the spring, there still are plenty of buyers out there, and the drop isn't as significant as you might think.

The other advantage of selling in the summer months is that this is when the serious buyers are out looking. The looky-loos aren't going to go window shopping when it's 115 degrees outside. The serious buyers want to find their homes as quickly as possible. They will narrow their searches to only the homes at the top of their list to keep the process as short as possible.

RELOCATION BUYERS

Phoenix is ranked one of the top cities for job growth and population growth. Therefore, we are seeing more and more people relocating from out of state. These are the buyers who are here in the midst of our summer heat trying to find a home to move the family to as soon as school is out, which isn't until mid-June in other states.

HOME PRICE RANGE UNDER \$300K

The inventory for homes under \$300K is so low it's hard for buyers to find them in time to get in an offer. In Mesa, there are 15 percent fewer homes on the market in this price range compared to the same time last year and 32 percent fewer than in 2017. Sales were the same this year as they were last year, at 641 and 643 for April. If you do find one that still is active, you need to jump on it, view it right away and be ready to write a very strong offer.

HOME PRICE RANGE \$300K TO \$500K

Inventory in this price range is much higher, at 52 percent higher from the same time last year, and 23 percent higher than 2017. As of May 11, the number of homes currently under contract has increased by 26 percent, while sales for April 2019 had a huge increase of 41 percent. Even with 52 percent more inventory, the sales and pending sales have increased significantly, and we expect the summer to continue with this increased momentum.

HOME PRICE RANGE \$500K TO \$800K

This price range is seeing a 22 percent decrease in inventory for April 2019. The number of homes currently under contract as of May 11 has increased 15 percent over last year. With lower inventory and higher sales, this is now a very competitive price range.

HOME PRICE RANGE \$800K AND HIGHER

The charts do not give a true picture of this price range, as the volume is much lower and can skew the numbers. Inventory is slightly higher, but we have seen a large increase in home sales for April 2019.

I showed homes priced from \$1,000,000 to \$1,300,000 to a client in April. Of the four homes at which we looked, three went under contract within two weeks of us viewing them. Homes that had sat on the market for a couple of months were snapped up in April, which had the highest number of luxury homes sold in a single month. May is looking to continue that

As you can see from the statistics above, no matter your price range, we are in a very strong seller's market. Therefore, taking your home off the market, or even waiting to list, could have you losing out on the sale.

Mesa's Elliot Road Tech Corridor

Visionary City Leaders Find New Revenue Sources In Changing Retail Environment

t is no secret web-based retailers, like Amazon, A have radically changed the way we shop.

With more and more transactions taking place online each day, fewer local businesses are making face-to-face purchases. While the Internet

makes shopping much more convenient, the rise of e-commerce also has resulted in less sales tax revenue for cities. This national trend is alarming for cities, like Mesa, which do not have a primary property tax and are heavily dependent on sales tax revenue to fund necessary services.

Faced with the challenge of a changing retail environment, Mesa's leaders thought outside the box and planned ahead. Drawing inspiration from places like California's Silicon Valley and Virginia's Data Center Alley, Mesa developed a technology corridor along Elliot Road up against the large SRP power line situated between Guadalupe and Elliot.

The Elliot Road Tech Corridor was thoughtfully designed with the infrastructure needed to attract large data centers and industrial prospects. Why these types of businesses? First of all, we had the unique opportunity of place



and infrastructure. Secondly, data centers, manufacturers and industrial enterprises buy a large volume of electricity.

The City of Mesa has the capacity to charge sales tax on every kilowatt-hour of electricity purchased by businesses. Electricity sales taxes now generate millions of dollars in revenue every year for the city, helping to offset the decline in localized sales tax from retail operations.

The numbers are impressive. If an average data center has 120 megawatt power load,* that same data center can generate more than \$1.1 million in city sales tax revenue every year on electricity purchases alone—or roughly the equivalent of \$14,000 per acre.

Stretching along Elliot Road, from Signal Butte Road, to Hawes Road, Mesa's Elliot Road Tech Corridor currently is home to Apple's \$2 billion Global Command Center, EdgeCore, Niagara and more large-scale projects on the way. In fact, acreage in Mesa's Elliot Road Tech Corridor is being absorbed at an accelerating rate, offering continued opportunity for Mesa in the coming years.

Coming out of the recession was no easy feat for our past and present city leaders. In fact, they are to be commended for having the vision to think years ahead to mitigate our changing fiscal environment. Mesa needs to continue to build on this success and maximize revenue from the Elliot Road Corridor for years to come, while visioning new projects that provide our city with continued fiscal opportunity. The siren call of housing permit fees always is strongest when the economy is booming, but we must look ahead toward the future and continue to prepare for a changing world.

"GO Day is keyed to enticing first-time visitors to the great outdoors and enjoy the mountain-stream waters of the Salt River while floating in the *mini-Grand Canyon* of Tonto National Forest," said Salt River Tubing President and Chief Executive Officer Henri Breault.

"Our recreational paradise is a fun-filled adventure in the great outdoors. Pirates will set sail in their tubes on the Salt River, brandishing pirate hats, waving pirate flags and humming Yo, Ho, Ho, and a bottle of water," Henri continued. "Buccaneers can kick up their heels with the pirate line dancers, grab a photo opportunity with Smokey Bear, and ride our pirate warships (shuttle buses) to and from the Salt River. TUBING TIPS

Shooting the Salt River rapids is great fun, and company officials recommend the following helpful tubing tips to assist tubers in planning their floating beach blasts for the holiday weekend:

- A valid driver's license is required for a tube rental deposit per five tubes rented.
- Children must be at least 8 years or older and 4 feet tall for tubing and shuttle bus service.
- Life vests are strongly recommended for children, non-swimmers and inexperienced swimmers.
- Glass containers by law are not allowed in the Salt





River Recreational Area. Ice chests will be inspected for glass containers before boarding shuttle buses. Please use plastic bottles or aluminum can containers.

- Have a great time during your floating beach blasts, but remember that drugs, alcohol and the Salt River do not mix. Responsibly appoint a designated driver before your tubing adventure.
- Floating picnic ideas include fresh fruit, burritos, fried chicken or sandwiches. Pack picnic items in Ziploc bags to keep dry. Please stash and bag all picnic supplies in litter bags while floating.
- Ice chest/coolers: Fill with ice, sport drinks, fruit juice and water. One to two bottles of water per hour while floating are recommended to help prevent dehydration.

Proper Post-Stroke Care Can Contribute TO SUCCESSFUL HOME RECOVERY

ollowing a stroke, it is important to do everything possible to help promote a successful recovery once the patient is at home.

Here are seven tips that can contribute to overall success:

1. FOLLOW THE ADVICE OF EXPERTS

Even after you transition home, it is critical to maintain regular appointments with your doctors, especially your neurologist. Typically, post-stroke patients visit their neurologist at least once every six weeks early in the recovery. However, more than half of stroke survivors fail to comply with recommended follow-up visits and do not see any specialists during their recovery.

2. ADAPT YOUR HOME TO YOUR NEEDS

Depending on the severity of your stroke, you may require medical equipment, such as a walker, wheelchair or hospital bed, in the home. In addition, your home may require safety modifications before you can feel comfortable. Your doctors, therapists and discharge planners should be able to advise you on the equipment you will need at home.

3. FOLLOW UP ON YOUR BLOOD WORK

Because strokes are caused by a reduction in blood flow to the brain, your physician usually will prescribe anticoagulants to facilitate your recovery. The dosage is adjusted based on your blood flow. Therefore, regular blood testing is critical to ensuring a safe and accurate dosage. Your doctors will advise you on the proper procedure and timing for your blood work.

4. UNDERSTAND YOUR LIMITATIONS

We all value our independence, and many of us are accustomed to an active lifestyle. However, anyone recovering from a stroke must understand that the recovery process cannot be rushed. Your brain is gradually rebuilding damaged synapses, which can cause mental fogginess or a sense of mild confusion. Your body is recovering,

as well, and activities that once were routine, such as walking or hand movement, may present new physical challenges. Understand that you can take steps to address them. Receiving support from a caregiver or a loved one can help with your physical needs. In addition, memory exercises, such as keeping an activity notebook, can improve cognitive function.

5. DO AS MUCH AS YOU CAN

Though you should never endanger yourself or risk your recovery by doing too much too soon, it is important that you attempt basic tasks with which you feel comfortable. Your efforts will facilitate your physical recovery, and small accomplishments can provide a big mental boost and propel you toward your long-term goals. Take incremental steps and utilize support from family or caregivers for daily activities that pose a challenge.

6. MAINTAIN YOUR THERAPY SCHEDULE

Though your therapy needs (physical, occupational or speech) may vary, it is important to start therapy as soon as possible and remain consistent with your appointments and recommended exercises. Though your initial therapy sessions may be trying, maintain focus on your long-term goals. Your therapists are trained professionals



who have helped numerous post-stroke patients and can act as expert guides in the critical weeks following a stroke.

7. WATCH YOUR DIET

It is important to limit your intake of fat, cholesterol and sodium to prevent unnecessary stress on your body. It may be tempting to indulge in comfort foods, but a balanced diet is essential to a healthy recovery. It also is important to maintain a regular meal schedule, even though you may not be hungry. Proper nutrition and caloric intake give your body the energy it needs to heal.

HOME CARE ASSISTANCE

Post-stroke recovery is a challenge. Home Care Assistance can help. A stroke can be an extremely challenging medical event with which to cope and from which to recover. Patients must simultaneously overcome physical, cognitive and emotional challenges. Many stroke survivors report frustrations with the recovery process.

In a recent survey of more than 1,000 stroke survivors, more than 40 percent felt somewhat or not very successful in meeting their rehabilitation goals, and 38 percent felt they lacked information relevant to their recovery. Regardless of the severity of your stroke, it is critical to take a proactive and informed approach to your post-stroke care. Often, a caregiver can help ease the physical and emotional stress.




