Holiday safety advice comes in handy

→ he holiday season is just around the corner and what many don't realize is that the holiday times can put our families at a greater risk for fire and safety issues in the home.

The Mesa Fire and Medical Department shared with me the following tips to stay safe around the holidays.

KITCHEN SAFETY

Kitchen fires are the No. 1 cause of home fires according to the National Fire Protection Agency.

A few ways to reduce cooking risks is to stay in the kitchen while you are cooking over the stovetop. This allows you to keep an eye on the food and make sure it's not overflowing or burning.

When it comes to cooking a turkey or other items stay in the home to monitor. Save the walk or shopping activities for after the meal, once the cooking appliances have been turned off.

Plan activities for children to keep them away from the kitchen while cooking. Dangling cords, hot plates, knives, and hot food that may splash are all hazards that can be easily avoided.

HOLIDAY DÉCOR

Follow all manufacturer directions. Replace any string lights that are worn or broken. Connect no more than three strands of mini lights together, or a maximum of 50 screw-in bulbs together so you don't overload a circuit. Use clips, instead of nails, to hang lights - as to not damage cords.

down. When placing, keep in mind that they can pop or flare up from the melted wax.

Artificial, flame retardant trees and decorations can provide assurance in not having to worry about them drying out and becoming a fire hazard. For those who love a real tree, keep water in the stand and check daily to ensure freshness.

HOLIDAY HEALTH

Keeping your family safe includes keeping them healthy. Wash hands frequently to stop the spread of germs of colds and flu. Avoid contact with others to stop the spread of germs. 

Matt has been inspired to go on and take the more advanced pre-paramedic foundational courses and paramedic coursework, with his immediate goal to get a job as an emergency responder with a local fire department and longer-term objective to go to medical school.

Emergency Medical Technicians provide transportation and emergency medical care outside the hospital environment for critical and emergency patients, or within the healthcare system as emergency room technicians. EMTs may continue their education to become firefighters, nurses, physician assistants, paramedics or medical doctors.

Mesa Public Schools forms

employee recruitment partnership

Story by Heidi Hurst Photo by Tim Hacker n the summer of 2019, Arizona L Superintendent of Public Instruction, Kathy Hoffman, approached Mesa Public Schools Superintendent, Ember Conley, with an idea: a pilot partnership between the district and the Arizona Department of Economic Security, or



DES. The goal? To help alleviate a classified employee shortage.

"Running a successful school takes a team of talented professionals working alongside our educators, but many school districts have struggled to fill critical positions such as classroom aides, bus drivers, cafeteria workers and other paraprofessionals," Kathy said. "These positions are needed to ensure student achievement and can help build a pipeline of future educators."

In early September 2019, ARIZONA@WORK, the workforce development section of DES, held the first of several Mesa Public Schools job fairs. In many cases, applicants had not previously considered working at a school district, unaware of the range of opportunities, including trade and technical positions. More than 30 employees have been hired as a result of the partnership.

Kathy is thrilled with the results of the pilot partnership, and she looks forward to expanding the opportunity to districts throughout the state.

"The success of this partnership between Mesa Public Schools and Department of Economic Security provides a blueprint we can use to support the staffing needs of school districts across the state," Kathy said. "I'm excited to see what we can accomplish on a wider scale."

Mountain View Cross Country **FEAMS RUN TO VICT**

fter winning the City Championships on Oct. 24, the Mountain View Toros men's cross country team ran to victory at the Sectional Championships on Nov. 6.

The Toro women, picked to place a distant third, exceeded expectations with a second-place Sectionals finish.

Team captain, Matt Judd, set a new personal record, running the 3.1-mile Sectionals course in 15 minutes 46 seconds, the fifth-fastest Mountain View race time in history. He placed first individually at City and third at Sectionals. Running close behind him for the team victory were his brother Josh Judd, Brady Eagar, Raul Reyna, Kevin DeGroff, Mark Anderson, and Addison Belnap. Raphel Miranda also ran with the varsity squad for the City Championship.

The Mountain View men's team has won the City Championship 21 years in a row, but preseason rankings this year predicted them to place third in the city.

According to Coach Ronnie Buchanan, "The boys knew that they weren't going into the City meet as No. 1 ranked, and they had to work diligently to improve through the season and execute good races in order to earn the school's continued streak of City Championships."

"The runners know that family and friends before them have carried on the legacy at Mountain View, and they want to be part of that tradition. Doing their very best and running for something bigger than themselves helps motivate them," he concluded.

Anne Kocherhans led the young Toro women's team at Sectionals, finishing in 19 minutes, 9 seconds, the 10th fastest time in Mountain View's history. She was followed by Abigail Welch, Ryanna Petersen, Eliza Elcock, Avery Juvan, Lindsay Welch, and Tara Funk. They placed second at the Sectionals meet with 88 points, and all their runners finished within a minute and a half of each other.

Coach Russell McElhaney is enthusiastic about their performance and potential. "With only two seniors and 10 girls brand new to cross country, this year's team was very young. Even so, there was really good team chemistry. The girls bought into the plan and saw outstanding growth, which continues—the team finished third in City, but just notched a second-place finish out of the whole Section. Next stop: State!"

The men's team is also poised to continue to compete well. With almost all their runners returning next year, they look forward to another strong season in 2020.



CHRISTMAS CRACKERS

Growing up in England, no matter where you went for Christmas dinner – friends, family, hotels, restaurants - the table setting would always include the traditional Christmas crackers. They have been a tradition for the English Christmas dinner since their inception. Even the royal family will have Christmas crackers adorning their

Christmas dinner table. I wanted to carry on the tradition for my

family here in

America and I

used to have to get them shipped in from England, but now they can be found everywhere, from Costco, to World Market and Bed Bath and Beyond, as well as many other stores.

So, what are they? Created by Tom Smith, in 1847, the crackers are cardboard tubes covered in brightly colored twisted paper. When the cracker is pulled by two people, each holding one end of the twisted paper, the friction creates a small pop. The cardboard tube contains a brightly colored paper hat (which I make everyone wear, whether they want to or not), a small gift and a motto or joke.

It's a standing joke that the mottos or jokes are unfunny, corny and often well known, as the same jokes have been appearing in crackers for decades.

Each person takes the end of the cracker and pulls. Or if there is a group around the table, everyone crosses their arms to pull all the crackers at once. Everyone holds their own cracker in their right hand and pulls their neighbor's cracker with their free left hand.

The price you pay will depend on the gifts inside. They are usually inexpensive with little trinket gifts, but you can go all out and order extravagant or custom gifts. There are Christmas crackers that have games inside rather than gifts. We did these last year and had so much fun watching our little wind up snowmen race to the finish line.

The Christmas cracker dates back to Victorian times, when in the early 1850s, London confectioner Tom Smith started adding a motto to his sugared almond bon-bons, which he sold wrapped in a twisted paper package. As many of his bon-bons were bought by men to give to women, many of the mottos were simple love poems.

He was inspired to add the bang when he heard the crackle of a log he had just put on the fire. He decided to make a log-shaped package that would produce a surprise bang and inside would be an almond and a motto. Soon the sugared almond was replaced with a small gift. Originally sold as the Cosaque, it soon became known by the public as the cracker.

The paper hat was added to the cracker in the early 1900s by his sons and by the end of the 1930s, the love poems had been replaced by jokes or limericks. The cracker was soon adopted as a traditional festive custom and today

virtually every English household has at least one box of crackers to pull over Christmas.

Christmas crackers are a lot of fun the whole family will love. We pull our crackers as soon as we all sit at the table before we eat (watch out for flying gifts), and then go around the table telling the jokes throughout the meal. For us Brits, Christmas just isn't Christmas without them.

So, next time you are at the store and see these brightly colored crackers, buy a box, and start a new family tradition. I would love to hear from anyone who tries them this year.

Another family tradition is to make the breakfast casserole Christmas Eve, so it's ready to pop in the oven on Christmas morning and bake while we open presents. This is Rick's family's recipe that has been passed down and he is always the one to make it while I just sit and watch (now I know why I like Christmas so much).

RECIPE

Breakfast Casserole

1/2 pound sausage browned (we use hot Jimmy Dean to add some flavor)

9 eggs—lightly beaten 3 cups half and half (we use 1/2 skim milk and 1/2 half and half and can't tell the difference)

1 teaspoon salt

1 1/2 pounds cheddar cheese

10 slices bread, crusts removed—or enough to cover the bottom of the pan

- Butter one side of the bread and put butter side down in 9-by-13 baking dish.
- Mix eggs and milk mixture, add salt.
- Layer sausage and cheese twice on top of bread. Then, pour eggs and milk mixture over. Top with a layer of cheese.
- Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour.

This type of ornament was also known as silvered glass and were handblown, double-walled glass ornaments that were filled with a silver liquid solution, usually mercury, then sealed. This type of ornament was very fragile, so intact examples in good condition are becoming more difficult to find.

Thoughtful, Conscientious Middle Schoolers? It's Possible!

s parents of middle school age students, you know well that your children learn angles, algebra, and vectors by day; and display anger, aggression, and victimization at night.

This is a time of contrasts. However, we can make this period go much more smoothly.

Here are the facts: your preteen and teenager's brain has not developed the thinking, rational part of their brain yet and worse, their emotional part is not well connected with what rational part there is.

Yet, there is hope. Teaching critical thinking can help expedite the development of the rational part. Empathy can ensure your teenager continues appreciating you as a source of support.

Up until now, you have spent 10 plus years of your life loving, cleaning up after, fawning, and cherishing your children. You have loved them profoundly and wildly. While they never know the depths to which you adore them, it really does not matter, because you would do it anyway. And then comes puberty and—without warning or a grace period—those times are replaced by unpredictable, often ungrateful and reckless teenage behavior that seems almost willfully irrational. You are heartbroken. What happened?

It probably does not help to say that you went through this yourself. I did too. I know this to be true because humans by design must go through this. You see the brain develops slowly and, shall we say, inconveniently.

The first parts of the brain to develop are the ones essential for existence: the areas that automate breathing, heart rate, etc. The next area to develop is the region called the limbic system. This region is also referred to as the lizard brain because it is the part of the brain that cannot think the way humans do.

The last part of the brain to develop is the frontal lobe. When humans become teenagers, their frontal lobe is only about 80 percent developed. The remaining 20 percent will complete by the time they are 20 years old. Worse yet, the connections between the neurons are not developed. So, while the frontal lobe may be 80 percent developed, the



connections to the lizard brain may remain few.

Fortunately, the brain is pliable and responsive. Despite teenagers' underdeveloped rational portion of their brain, with concerted effort, the rational portion can actually grow and improve!

How so? By participating in critical thinking. Parents and teachers should engage with teenagers in critical thinking often. Critical thinking is a type of analytical thinking which involves understanding not only what is going on but why it is so. It is more than remembering and repeating. It is examining, evaluating, problem-solving, taking apart and putting back together.

Parents can do this with their teenagers by getting them to think about the cause and effect of future events. You can ask them:

How are things related?

What do you think that person was thinking? What if you do X, what would happen? What if you

What is your goal? What would be helpful behaviors? What would be unhelpful behaviors and why? That last question is very important!

What do you think things are like from this person's point of view? How would you describe your perspective

Ask these questions when there is nothing at stake; when you and your teenager are not arguing about using the car or buying those designer jeans. Basically, have this conversation at a time when the situation does not evoke strong emotions. It is also important to be empathetic during your discussions. Remember, you are dealing with teenagers and their underdeveloped brains.

Parenting at this stage is different than parenting younger children. Teenagers are beginning to become independent, and your job at this stage is to teach them how to do so. It is similar to teaching a child to ride a bike. They are going to fall. They are going to make mistakes, crash, and hurt themselves. They are not going to know what they are doing nor even how to fix it. However, they will eventually get it. Until then, you will keep them going forward helping them with one hand, partly to let them know you are there and partly to steady them. Eventually though, you will have to let go, and things will be different for the rest of their lives.

Programs like Self Development Academy are helpful too. Self Development Academy recognizes that teenagers can improve their critical thinking by teaching them. The program starts in kindergarten, teaching logic and reasoning early on, to give children and teenagers a jump start. In middle school, teenagers learn errors in thinking (fallacies), formal logic (which is not taught until college) and philosophy.

A recent research study showed that nearly half of the millennials and teenagers received an 'F' in critical thinking. While neurological development is to blame, we can still accelerate the process of developing critical thinking. Parents and schools can engage teenagers in critical thinking tasks and assignments in low stakes settings. We can be patient and empathetic, understanding that millions of years of biological development have put our patience at a disadvantage. It is an uphill battle, but we can chip away at the mountain and turn Everest into a field where everyone can stand on equal footing.
