La Mesa Ministries will host CHARITY POKER RUN

his November, Mesa will be home to the first annual Charity Poker Run, presented by La Mesa Ministries and the Eden Village project. Visitors to the charity event will see Harley-Davidson rides, raffles, and a responsibility to the community.

La Mesa Ministries is presenting the charity event at the Desert Wind Harley-Davidson location at 922 S. Country Club Drive, benefiting Eden Village of Arizona on Saturday, Nov. 9. Registration is from 9 to 11 a.m. with a cost of \$25 per rider, and \$10 per passenger.

Eden Village USA is a nationwide program, with the tagline "No one sleeps outside." For years, Eden Village has been building communities of tiny homes for people living with homelessness and disabilities. With the partnership of La Mesa Ministries, this dream has finally reached Mesa, Ariz.

"It takes a community to build a community," said Rick McClellan, executive director of La Mesa Ministries. "We want as many people to be involved with this as possible to make it a success."

As the 21-home village was just approved for development in early September, this will be the first major fundraising event to help fund the construction of the village.

The poker run, for those unfamiliar with Desert Wind Harley-Davidson, will include several hotspots that bikers and passengers will stop at, take a photo, and receive a set of cards. The stops will be at points of interest around town where anyone can stop for a bite to eat... only if they don't want the free lunch offered at the donation site from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m., accessible to all riders and volunteers.

Riders who win a poker hand will earn the chance to be named the winner of one of three raffles. There will be a gun raffle, a cigar box raffle, and a general prize raffle too.

Desert Wind Harley-Davidson, La Mesa Ministries, and Eden Village USA proudly come together in solidarity for their community. Providing permanent

housing, and a community that feels like home to people living with homelessness, disability, and often substance use

disorder is a mission these organizations are passionate about and have the experience to see it through.

"There's nowhere for these people to go, there's no affordable housing," charity organizer Stephanie Roberts said. "People [at] La Mesa Ministries and Eden Village, they are the ones causing real change." Rick, who has been in the home-

building business since the early '70s, feels honored to give back to the community with the knowledge he has now. When he met Stephanie and her husband, a Harley biker, a connection was forged.

Sometime later, a journey for La Mesa Ministries and Desert Wind Harley-Davidson would begin, a match made in heaven.

La Mesa Ministries and the members of Christ Greenfield Lutheran Church have long been beloing.

Greenfield Lutheran Church have long been helping people without housing and financial struggles in Mesa. For 10 years, sharing meals and the values of Christ, soon they will have 21 people in a community built by the love of Mesa residents, and the dedication of Eden Village USA.



WHY NOW MAY BE THE BEST TIME TO BUY A HOME

lot of buyers are holding off on entering the market, waiting for interest rates to come down. This hesitation is opening up more opportunities for those ready to buy right now. The Federal Reserve has already started

cutting rates, and more reductions are expected. This is great news for potential buyers, but the best opportunity to buy may be before these rate drops are fully in place.

When rates do drop, the buyers who have been on the sidelines will likely rush back into the market. With the same amount of inventory and more competition, we could see prices start to climb again and the current buyer incentives sellers are offering disappear.

MARKET SHIFT FROM SELLERS TO BUYERS

After being in a fierce seller's market for years, in 2022 the landscape shifted as interest rates increased dramatically and prices hit their peak. The buyers hit the stop button, prices dropped, and inventory increased. While the market started to come back in 2023, 2024 has been relatively slow and with the increase in supply we have shifted from a seller's market to a balanced market although it feels much more like a buyer's market right now.

RISING INVENTORY

With buyers sitting on the sidelines again inventory increased and is currently 49 percent higher than a year ago. This increased supply gives buyers more options and room to negotiate, especially with sellers who need to move their homes quickly.

SELLERS ARE MOTIVATED

One major advantage for buyers right now is the motivation of current sellers. While many are waiting until the spring to list their homes, some sellers need to sell now.

This urgency is leading to more price reductions and sellers offering incentives we haven't seen in years.

STRONG NEGOTIATION POWER

In the current market conditions, the buyer has strong negotiating power — something you might not have once the market picks back up again.

Now is a great time to negotiate not only on the purchase price but asking the seller to contribute to the buyer's closing costs and rate buy down, which can reduce the buyer's monthly mortgage payment.

Buyers are also able to negotiate on repairs, with sellers more willing to do extra repairs than they were when we were in a seller's market.

BUY NOW REFINANCE LATER

Don't miss out on a great buyer's market because you think you may be able to get a lower interest rate later. If rates continue to drop and are a good deal lower in six months, you can just refinance then and get into the lower rate, but you have already purchased the home at the lower price and with better terms.

THE ELECTION IMPACT

Another reason some buyers are hesitating is the upcoming election. It's not uncommon for people to feel uncertain about making big financial decisions during political changes. Every election year, we see the market slow down as buyers wait to see what happens. But once the election is over, these buyers — along with those holding out for lower interest rates — will likely flood back into the market.



When that happens, the inventory we have now will go fast. Without enough new listings, we could quickly see multiple offers and increased competition again especially with spring being Arizona's busiest real estate season, with March, April, and May typically seeing the highest sales.

A STRONG SPRING MARKET?

The market is gearing up for a shift, and we're expecting a strong spring in 2025. With the Federal Reserve likely to continue lowering rates and so many buyers waiting on the sidelines, we'll probably see a big surge in activity once rates drop enough and the election is behind us. With two or three times more buyers competing for the same homes we have now — inventory will shrink fast, and we could be right back to a seller's market with multiple offers and bidding wars.

DON'T WAIT TOO LONG

We're in a sweet spot right now, but how long will it last? Buyers have the upper hand, inventory is higher, and motivated sellers are offering better terms. If you wait, you might find yourself in a much more competitive market in just a few months — higher prices, fewer options, and likely multiple offers.

Right now, with less competition, more favorable pricing, and better terms, this could be the best window of opportunity.

A BRIGHT SPOT ON THE HORIZON

If the rates continue to come down and come down low enough, the sellers who had super low interest rates in the three's and didn't want to give that up may decide it's finally time to make a move and we will see more homes coming on the market. However, those sellers will also be buying again, so while the supply may increase with these sellers, so will the demand. ■

Mesa College Promise program offers **ADULT LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES**

Tf you're an adult looking to expand your learning opportunities, but cost has been a barrier, Mesa Community College may have just what you need, and your classes just got more within reach. MCC has expanded its Mesa College Promise program to people 24 years of age and older and the tuition is completely free for people who meet a few criteria.

Mesa College Promise, kick started by Mesa Mayor John Giles as a public private partnership between MCC and various corporate entities, eliminates the No. 1 barrier to adult higher education - cost.

"The Mesa College Promise plays a vital role in connecting Mesa residents with pathways to higher education and better job prospects, and the expansion of the Promise to adult learners multiplies its potential," Mayor Giles said about expanding the program. "The business community understands the value of postsecondary education and through their integral support of the program, they are helping to build the workforce of tomorrow. I could not be happier that more Mesa residents will have the opportunity to pursue higher education."

Students must demonstrate a financial need by completing the FAFSA financial aid application, have earned a high school diploma or GED, not yet have



attained a degree, and enroll in at least six credits to be eligible for the Promise program.

More than 70 percent of the students participating in the Mesa College Promise program are the first in their families to attend college.

Mesa College Promise supports the Achieve60AZ statewide attainment goal that at least 60 percent of all Arizona adults have a high-value workforce certification or college degree by 2030. A survey conducted by Education Forward Arizona shows that 86 percent of the state's residents support that goal.

"The Mesa College Promise, aimed at adults, embodies our collective commitment to the Achieve60AZ goal. By offering accessible pathways to higher education, programs like the Mesa College Promise play a pivotal role in allowing us to achieve this much-needed goal," said Education Forward Arizona CEO, Rich Nickel. "By providing comprehensive support for Mesa residents to pursue postsecondary education, we not only remove barriers to achievement but also pave the way for a more educated, skilled, and competitive workforce!"

Businesses, corporate interests, and individuals have donated \$760,000 to the Mesa College Promise program, and Google has kicked in an additional \$100,000 to expand the program, helping cover the newly eligible adult learners.

"Google's sponsorship is not just a financial investment; it's an integral part of our commitment to this community and to breaking down entrenched financial barriers that have historically impeded students from pursuing higher education," said Dr. Kate Franko, Google's regional head of data center public affairs for Arizona. "Mesa College Promise is a shining example of what can be achieved through collaborative efforts between the local government, educational institutions, and corporate partners."

In addition to the cost of tuition, students receive a \$250 stipend to use toward the cost of books, transportation, and other education-related expenses. MCC also



loans the students an iPad for the first two years of the Promise program.

Students are also assigned an individual advisor to not only help them choose classes, but tutor them, and offer individual academic and personal support. Students also have access to boot camps, workshops and counseling, and volunteer and internship opportunities.

Mesa College Promise welcomed its first group of 88 students in 2021 and the numbers have grown steadily; 201 participated in 2022 and an additional 200 took part

MCC offers adults wanting to further their education additional opportunities through its New Frontiers for Lifelong Learning program, too. New Frontiers is for the curious and for people interested in learning for the love

The program offers non-credit classes in everything from travel and leisure to history and politics, and from finances to real estate classes to understanding a day in the life of a firefighter. New Frontiers even offers tours of the Maricopa County Tabulation and Election Center, and the storied B-17 Sentimental Journey based at Falcon Field.

There is an annual fee of \$80 to enroll in the New Frontiers program.
